Who is This Course For?

There are three types of participants on this journey:

**The Individual Disciple** – You are a FOLLOWER of Jesus Christ, longing for deeper discipleship and ready to be transformed by His Grace working through the Father's Love. You

desire to grow and mature IN CHRIST, and step into your Kingdom calling. You are a wise virgin wanting to invest all FIVE TALENTS God gave you as a gift of His Grace. By Grace you are ready to lay down your life in exchange for HIS.

**The Small Group Participant** – You are taking this journey with others in a home group or Bible study, hungry for fresh, Holy Spirit-led revelation that will strengthen and unite your fellowship with others IN CHRIST in order to change the world around you in Jesus name.

"IMMEDIATELY the one who had received the FIVE TALENTS went and traded with them, and gained five more talents." **Matthew 25:16** 

**The RADICAL GENEROSITY Leader** – You are an entrepreneur, business owner, government official, or ministry leader looking for ways to infuse Grace into your leadership and create a culture of RADICAL GENEROSITY IN CHRIST within your organization.

"Now after a long time the master of those slaves \*came and \*settled accounts with them."

Matthew 25:19

No matter which category you fall into, you are here by divine appointment. The Holy Spirit has drawn you into this course for a reason. Jesus is calling you higher, deeper, further—into the immeasurable riches of His Grace!

"The one who had received the FIVE TALENTS came up and brought five more talents, saying, 'Master, you entrusted FIVE TALENTS to me. See, I have gained FIVE MORE TALENTS. His master said, 'Well done, good and faithful slave. You were faithful with a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master.' " Matthew 25:21-22

#### How to Get the Most Out of This Study

Pray, read, and study six days per week, and take off the Sabbath. Each day's lesson is structured to guide you into real encounters with Jesus as you study, reflect, and apply His Word to your life—and King Jesus, your Rabbi and Teacher will transform from the inside-out!.

#### *Here's how to navigate the study*:

**PRAY** - Start each day with prayer. Go to the Father's Throne of Grace and meet with King Jesus. Worship and thank Him, and surrender yourself in HIS absolute humility and obedience. Soak in His presence. And then, finish the reading period with more prayer. We suggest that you start each day with 30 minutes of prayer, 30 minutes of reading, and then finish with 30 more minutes of prayer.

**READ & ABSORB** – After prayer, read the daily assigned five-page section of **THE Grace Awakening**. Five pages takes about 30-minutes of slow, "soaking-type" reading. Ready, soak,

study. Take your time, and let THE TRUTH sink into your heart. After reading, closing in grateful, thankful, prayer.

**ENGAGE WITH THE STUDY GUIDE** – Use the provided Briefs, Facilitators Notes, and Grace Coaching Notes to help you reflect on what you've learned and be ready to share it with others immediately.

**ASK THE HOLY SPIRIT** – As you study... Pause. Pray. Invite the Holy Spirit to search your heart, reveal THE TRUTH, and transform you from the inside out.

**LIVE IN RADICAL GENEROSITY** – Each day includes a RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive—a challenge to live out Grace in real, tangible ways. Step out boldly and be the hands and feet of Jesus.

**DISCUSS & SHARE** – If you are in a group setting, engage in deep, meaningful conversations about Grace. Share your revelations and testimonies.

**MULTIPLY THE IMPACT** – Don't keep this Grace to yourself! Invite others into this study. Share what God is doing in your life. The Grace you receive is meant to be given away!

# Day 1: The Grace Awakening Begins – Pages 1 to 5

<u>Brief</u>: Welcome to **THE Grace Awakening**—a journey that is not just about reading but about experiencing true transformation by Grace working through love. This is not an ordinary eBook; it is a call to action, a divine summons for every disciple of Christ to awaken to God's ABSOLUTE GOODNESS, to abide in Him, and to become a fully surrendered apprentice of Jesus Christ.

From the very beginning, Jesus Christ made discipleship the heartbeat of His ministry. He didn't just teach information—He transformed lives. Now, He calls us to do the same. The Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20) is not optional; it is our mission. As you embark on this study,

understand that you are being trained to REIGN WITH CHRIST, to disciple others, and to expand His Kingdom by Grace, working through love. This first section lays the foundation:

- Spiritual formation is God's work in you—not your own striving.
- Repetition of Scripture is a divine strategy for deep transformation.

- RADICAL GENEROSITY means fully surrendering to Christ and living in unbroken fellowship with the Trinity.

For Group Facilitators: Begin with Matthew 28:18-20—remind participants that the Great Commission is at the center of **THE Grace Awakening**. Ask: What does it mean to be an "apprentice of Jesus" rather than just a believer? Challenge the group to read the Scriptures aloud repeatedly, allowing the Holy Spirit to write them on their hearts. Encourage prayer before reading—asking God to personally reveal His truth through His Word. Discuss how repetition in Scripture brings revelation and transformation over time. Close with an invitation for each participant to commit to full surrender to King Jesus—and to let the Holy Spirit lead them directly as they walk through this journey of FAITH.

"And Jesus came up and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: The time is now. The Spirit of God is awakening His people, calling us to something deeper, something bigger than ourselves. Jesus is not looking for spectators—He is calling disciples who will abide in Him, walk in Grace, and disciple others. This eBook is not designed for those who just want information—it is for those who are ready to be transformed. Are you ready? Jesus is your only Teacher. He alone will lead you into truth. Your part? Surrender. Let Him renew your mind. Is Romans 12:1-2 your posture? Humility? Only the meek and teachable will experience transformation. Is 1 Peter 5:6 your training? Repeated meditation on Scripture allows the Holy Spirit to change you from the inside out. Is Hebrews 4:12-13 your mission? You are not just here to learn—you are here to be trained to reign WITH CHRIST. (Matthew 28:18-20)

Jesus is building His Church, and you are part of it. As you read, as you meditate, as you pray—ask the Lord: "Am I fully surrendered to Your Kingdom? Am I ready to be discipled so I can disciple others?"

"Therefore I urge you, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect." **Romans 12:1-2** 

"Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you at the proper time," **1 Peter 5:6** 

"For the word of God is living and active and sharper than any two-edged sword, and piercing as far as the division of soul and spirit, of both joints and marrow, and able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart. And there is no creature hidden from His sight, but all things are open and laid bare to the eyes of Him with whom we have to do." **Hebrews 4:12-13** 

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive:</u> **The Grace Awakening** is not just about receiving—it is about giving away what God has freely given to you. RADICAL GENEROSITY is all about the Five Talents you've been given. The most RADICAL GENEROSITY is not just material—it is pouring out your life to disciple others.

#### Today:

- Give Jesus your full surrender. Commit to making Him your Teacher—not man, not books, not theology, but the Holy Spirit of TRUTH.
- Give someone the Word of God. Share a Scripture that has impacted you with someone who needs encouragement.
- Give your time. Pray for someone, offer mentorship, or invest in a relationship with eternity in mind.
- Give away an earthly possession—something meaningful, as an act of surrender and trust in God's provision.

# 3 Challenge Questions:

- What does it mean for you to fully surrender to Jesus as your Teacher, Rabbi, and King?
- Why do you think repetition of Scripture is important in **Spiritual Formation**? How will you practice this?
- How can you begin to disciple others as you go through **THE Grace Awakening**? Who can you invite into this journey with you?

This is not just a Study Guide—it is a training ground for reigning with Christ. Jesus is calling His Bride to awaken, to abide, and to walk in the fullness of His Grace. Will you say yes? Will you surrender? Will you receive His Word and let it transform you? The journey begins now!

### Day 2: A Call to Absolute Surrender – Pages 6 to 10

<u>Brief</u>: Day 2 introduces the participant to the foundational call of **THE Grace Awakening**, which is the *Absolute Surrender to Jesus Christ as Lord, Savior, Master, Teacher, and King*. Many BELIEVERS know Jesus as their Savior, but few have fully surrendered their lives to His Lordship. They have not made Jesus their King. The Holy Spirit is drawing His people into a radical transformation—where Jesus is not just a part of life but the very essence of it.

This section speaks directly to teens, parents, *professionals*, *leaders*, *the weary*, *the broken*, *and THE TRUTH-seekers*, calling each one to a life of deep surrender. It highlights that worldly success, personal struggles, or even previous religious experiences are not the final destination—Jesus Himself is. Surrendering all to Him is the only way to experience true rest, purpose, and abundant life in His Kingdom.

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Begin by reading aloud Hebrews 4:16 and John 1:14 to emphasize the Grace and truth found in Jesus. Discuss what it means to absolutely surrender to Jesus—not as a passive belief, but as an active yielding to His will. Ask participants to reflect: *Have you truly given everything to Christ?* If not, what is holding you back? Encourage testimonies of past experiences where surrendering to Jesus led to unexpected breakthroughs. Challenge the group to start praying daily for total surrender, asking the Holy Spirit to lead their every step.

"Therefore let us draw near with confidence to the throne of Grace, so that we may receive mercy and find Grace to help in time of need." **Hebrews 4:16** 

"And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of Grace and truth." **John 1:14** 

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: Jesus never called His disciples to partial surrender—He called them to leave everything behind and follow Him. Surrender is not loss—it is the greatest gain! When we surrender, we receive the fullness of Christ in return. The Holy Spirit is our Helper, constantly guiding us deeper into this reality. Living in absolute surrender means:

- Seeking Jesus as Teacher, Rabbi, Lord, Savior, and King every single day.
- Obeying His voice immediately, without delay.
- Viewing all work, business, family life, and ministry through the lens of God's Kingdom.

• Understanding that His will is always better than our own plans.

Ask Jesus directly: What areas of my life am I still holding back? Be ready to listen, obey, and act.

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: Absolute surrender leads to RADICAL GENEROSITY. The more we trust Jesus with everything, the more we realize that everything we have belongs to Him anyway. Demonstrate surrender by giving something valuable away—money, time, possessions, or even your full attention to someone in need. Ask Jesus who needs to experience His love through you today. Then act immediately. Possible actions:

- Pay for someone's meal unexpectedly.
- Give a sacrificial offering, trusting God to provide.
- Dedicate time to pray for a struggling friend or stranger.
- Offer free mentorship to someone who needs guidance.
- Forgive a debt someone owes you.
- Surrender in action is faith in motion!

### 3 Challenge Questions:

- What is keeping you from fully surrendering to Jesus as Lord in every area of your life?
- What is one tangible way you can demonstrate RADICAL GENEROSITY today as an act of surrender?
- If you were to live today as if Jesus were returning tomorrow, what would change?

This **Day 2** study is designed to move participants from head knowledge to heart transformation—leading them into a lifestyle of absolute surrender and RADICAL GENEROSITY.

#### Day 3: The Awakening to Grace – Pages 11 to 15

<u>Brief</u>: This section of THE Grace Awakening calls us to the radical realization of God's Grace, a divine invitation to live fully in His ABSOLUTE GOODNESS. Many have heard of Grace, but few

have truly awakened to its reality—THE TRUTH that Jesus is our only Teacher and Rabbi, and that His Grace is always available, always multiplying, and always transforming.

This is not a self-help journey or a religious method—this is the Holy Spirit-led transformation into the image of Christ. The awakening begins when we stop striving and start receiving—when we surrender everything and allow Jesus to become our life.

This chapter urges us to soak in the Word of God, to meditate on each verse, and to seek transformation, not just information. The Grace Awakening is not just a moment—it is a lifelong revelation of God's infinite goodness.

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Begin by reading aloud John 1:14, Hebrews 4:16, and 2 Peter 1:1-2. Ask participants: What does it mean for Jesus to be our only Teacher? How does that change the way we study the Bible? Discuss the importance of seeking God personally, rather than relying on human teachers. Challenge the group to practice meditating on Scripture, soaking in the Word, and waiting upon God's voice. End with a prayer of surrender to Jesus as the only Teacher and Lord of our lives.

"Therefore let us draw near with confidence to the throne of Grace, so that we may receive mercy and find Grace to help in time of need." **Hebrews 4:16** 

"And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of Grace and truth." **John 1:14** 

"Simon Peter, a bond-servant and apostle of Jesus Christ, T o those who have received a faith of the same kind as ours, by the righteousness of our God and Savior, Jesus Christ: Grace and peace be multiplied to you in the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord;" 2 Peter 1:1-2

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: Are you truly awakening to Grace? Or are you still holding onto human ideas, traditions, and religious striving?

The Word of God is living and active (Hebrews 4:12), and when we receive it directly from Jesus, it transforms us. Too often, we rely on preachers, books, and opinions—but Jesus is calling us to learn from Him directly.

"For the word of God is living and active and sharper than any two-edged sword, and piercing as far as the division of soul and spirit, of both joints and marrow, and able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart." **Hebrews 4:12** 

"Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." (Matthew 11:29) If we truly want to awaken to Grace, we must:

• Surrender our own understanding and let the Holy Spirit teach us.

- Stop relying on others to feed us spiritually—go to the Word directly.
- Spend time meditating on Scripture—reading slowly, praying, and waiting upon God.
- Test everything—including this study guide—against the Word of God.

Jesus is not just a good teacher—He is the only Teacher. His Grace multiplies as we behold Him (2 Peter 1:2). Are you ready to awaken?

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: If Grace is unlimited, then our giving should be unlimited. Radical generosity is the evidence that we have truly received Grace. Today, practice RADICAL GENEROSITY by:

- Giving your time—call someone, encourage them, and remind them of God's goodness.
- Giving a financial gift—not out of duty, but from the overflow of Grace.
- Sharing God's Word—text or message a verse to someone who needs encouragement.
- Offering forgiveness—if there is someone you need to release, do it today.

How does giving freely affect your awareness of the Father's Grace? What did the Holy Spirit reveal to you?

#### 3 Challenge Questions:

- Are you fully relying on Jesus as your Teacher, or are you depending on human sources for your spiritual growth?
- How can you slow down and truly meditate on God's Word, rather than just reading quickly?
- What is one way you can practice RADICAL GENEROSITY today, reflecting the unlimited Grace of God?

This is **THE Grace Awakening**—not just an awakening of knowledge, but an awakening to Jesus Himself. His Grace is infinite, always growing, always multiplying. Today, surrender to His teaching, His leading, and His transformation.

"Grace and peace be multiplied to you in the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord." **2 Peter**1:2

Let your Grace Awakening begin!

# Day 4: A Call to Absolute Surrender - Pages 16-20

<u>Brief</u>: Today's study is a call to absolute surrender to Jesus Christ. Many people come to faith IN CHRIST but still hold on to their own ways, plans, and desires, not realizing that true transformation begins with complete surrender. The world celebrates self-sufficiency and independence, but the Kingdom of God operates on the principle of surrender—where Christ is the center of everything.

Jesus invites us to embrace a life of radical trust, where we die to ourselves so that His life may reign in us fully. This segment urges us to let go of control and fully embrace God's will, allowing His Grace to lead us in every aspect of our lives.

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Ask the group: What does it mean to surrender everything to Jesus? Guide the participants in reflecting on areas where they still struggle with surrender. Discuss how total reliance on God brings peace and clarity rather than fear and anxiety. Challenge the group to commit to a specific act of surrender this week—whether a habit, fear, or future plan—placing it fully in God's hands.

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: Surrendering to Jesus is not a one-time event—it is a daily decision. Many BELIEVERS struggle with holding onto areas of their life, fearing that surrender means losing control. But Jesus promises that true life is only found in giving up our ways and embracing His.

He says in Mark 8:34-35, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake and the gospel's will save it." The greatest battle is often in the heart. Surrendering means trusting God's plan even when we don't understand it. It means choosing obedience over our feelings. It means acknowledging that apart from Jesus, we can do nothing.

"And He summoned the crowd with His disciples, and said to them, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake and the gospel's will save it."

Mark 8:34-35

Grace is not about trying harder but surrendering deeper. When you let go of self-sufficiency, you open yourself to receiving the unlimited Grace of God. Ask yourself:

- Am I clinging to areas of my life that I haven't surrendered to Jesus?
- Am I trusting Jesus fully, or am I still trying to control my circumstances?

Do I truly believe that God's plan is better than mine?

Take a moment today to pray and surrender something specific to Jesus. Release it into His hands and trust that His Grace is sufficient.

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: Radical generosity begins with radical surrender. When we let go of control, we allow God to use us as vessels of His love. Today, look for an opportunity to give generously—not just financially, but with your time, encouragement, and love.

Here are some ways to practice RADICAL GENEROSITY today:

- Surrender your time Call someone who is struggling and encourage them.
- Surrender your resources Give something meaningful to someone in need.
- Surrender your comfort Step out and share your testimony or pray for a stranger.

Radical generosity is an act of surrender. Ask Jesus to show you where He wants you to give today.

#### 3 Challenge Questions:

- What is one area of your life that you are struggling to fully surrender to Jesus?
- How does trusting in God's Grace change your perspective on surrender?
- How can you actively practice RADICAL GENEROSITY today as a demonstration of your trust in God?

Day 5: The Foundation of Grace - Pages 21 to 25

<u>Brief</u>: **The Grace Awakening** is not just about knowing God's plan—it is about seeing His will being carried out in and through us. Today, we receive the revelation that God has already redeemed us, led us out of bondage, and placed us into His promised land, flowing with milk and honey. Now, we are to receive His provision fully, by faith, and rest in His completed work.

Jesus teaches us that the wise build their house on the rock—on His words and promises—while the foolish build on shifting sand. This principle echoes throughout the Kingdom: Grace has already provided, and now we walk in the reality of His provision, power, and peace. The foundation of Grace is God's eternal, unchanging nature. Before the foundation of the world, He had a plan for us to walk in His righteousness, His favor, and His finished work.

We are reminded that Grace is not just an abstract concept but the manifestation of God's ABSOLUTE GOODNESS. It is His favor, wisdom, strength, and power made available to us, not by our own efforts, but through faith in Jesus.

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Encourage the group to reflect on what it means to fully receive the provision of Grace. Many Christians believe in salvation by Grace but struggle with living in that reality. Ask participants to consider areas where they are still striving in their own strength instead of receiving from God. Discuss what it means to be planted in God's promises and to build upon the foundation of Jesus. Questions for discussion:

- What does it mean to possess the land spiritually?
- How do we apply Matthew 7:24-27 to our daily lives?
- How does understanding Grace shift our perspective from striving to receiving?

"Therefore everyone who hears these words of Mine and acts on them, may be compared to a wise man who built his house on the rock. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and slammed against that house; and yet it did not fall, for it had been founded on the rock. Everyone who hears these words of Mine and does not act on them, will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand. <u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: Jesus has already finished the work. The land has already been given. The Kingdom has already been established. The question is—are we living in this truth?

When Israel entered the Promised Land, they were instructed to take full possession of it. But many of them hesitated, fearing the giants that remained. How often do we hesitate to take hold of the promises of God because we still see obstacles in our lives?

Grace does not mean that we will never face challenges, but it does mean that we are fully equipped to overcome them. Jesus is the Rock on which we build, and His words sustain us. Are you standing firm on the foundation of His finished work, or are you building on the shaky ground of self-effort?

Embrace THE TRUTH that you are righteous, redeemed, and fully supplied by Grace. It is time to stop striving and start receiving. Behold Jesus, who has already provided everything you need for life and godliness. Trust in Him, walk in His promises, and let His Grace be the solid foundation upon which you build every area of your life.

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: Since God has freely given us all things IN CHRIST, today is a day to reflect His RADICAL GENEROSITY. Consider ways in which you can embody this truth:

- Bless someone financially without expecting anything in return.
- Offer your time, wisdom, or resources to someone in need.
- Speak life into someone who is struggling, reassuring them of God's goodness and provision.

Radical generosity is not just about giving—it is about living in the overflow of God's abundance. Today, step into that abundance and give as Christ has given to you.

#### 3 Challenge Questions:

- In what areas of your life are you still trying to "earn" what God has already freely given?
- How does understanding the foundation of Grace change the way you approach challenges?
- What steps can you take today to fully receive and walk in the provision that God has already made available to you?

# Day 6: Walking in God's Blueprint – Pages 26 to 30

<u>Brief</u>: This section of **THE Grace Awakening** unveils God's divine blueprint, a master plan set in motion before the foundation of the world. It is not simply about seeing God's plans—it is about receiving them, walking in them, and living in the fullness of His promises—BY FAITH. The Grace of God is already fully given, and we are called to possess the land, knowing that His ABSOLUTE GOODNESS is our inheritance.

Before the world was formed, God already provided every answer, every provision, and every measure of Grace we would ever need. Our task is not to earn Grace but to receive it and allow it to manifest through us. Jesus, the Mediator of a new and better covenant, has removed every barrier between us and the Father (SHALOM PEACE). For BELIEVERS there is no more wrath, no more condemnation—only the free-flowing abundance of His Grace and righteousness.

We are reminded that we are not meant to strive—we are meant to reign through the abundance of Grace. We are invited to build our lives upon the Rock, walking in the eternal kingdom realities that have already been established IN CHRIST.

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Begin with Worship & Prayer: Invite the Holy Spirit to open hearts to receive the fullness of God's blueprint. Read aloud Matthew 7:24-28, Ephesians 1:4, and Romans 5:17. Ask participants: Do you truly believe that God has already prepared the way for you? If so, what is stopping you from fully stepping into His provision? Discuss the difference

between striving and receiving. How do we shift from a works-based mindset to a Grace-based walk? Encourage participants to write down an area in their lives where they need to surrender control and trust that God has already made provision. Close in prayer, declaring faith over each person as they step into God's Grace.

"For if by the transgression of the one, death reigned through the one, much more those who receive the abundance of Grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the One, Jesus Christ." **Romans 5:17** 

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: God's ABSOLUTE GOODNESS is not just an idea—it is a living reality that we are called to walk in, manifest, and reflect. Jesus came to establish the Kingdom on earth, and we are called to co-labor with Him, building our lives on His unshakable foundation.

Many BELIEVERS are still living as if they are in the wilderness—wandering, striving, and waiting for provision. But THE TRUTH is this:

- We are already in the Promised Land.
- We have already been given every spiritual blessing.
- We are already seated with Christ in heavenly places.
- We are not waiting for victory—we are walking in it.

The question is not when God will move, but when will we believe that He already has?

Jesus asked the lame man in John 5:6, "Do you wish to get well?" The same question is before us today: Will we receive the fullness of Grace, or will we continue striving in our own strength?

There is no more striving. There is only resting in what He has already done. Identify an area of your life where you are still waiting for God to move, and instead, step into faith knowing He already has. Declare it DONE in Jesus' name and start walking in THE TRUTH of His finished work.

"And my God will supply all your needs according to His riches in glory IN CHRIST Jesus."

Philippians 4:19

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: When we understand that we have already received everything IN CHRIST, we become radically generous. We no longer give from lack—we give from abundance.

Here's how you can step into RADICAL GENEROSITY today:

- Give as if you lack nothing. Whether financially, emotionally, or through acts of kindness—give without hesitation, knowing that your Father has already supplied all your needs (Philippians 4:19).
- Invest in someone's future. Pour into someone's spiritual growth, mentoring, or training. God's blueprint includes generational impact.
- Speak life and prophecy over someone today. Declare God's ABSOLUTE GOODNESS over their life and help them see His provision already at work.

Let's, reflect: How does stepping into generosity shift our perspective on God's provision? What do we learn about His abundant Grace?

#### 3 Challenge Questions:

- Are you still waiting for God to move, or do you believe that He already has?
- What does it look like to build your life on the Rock instead of the shifting sands of self-reliance?
- How can you practically step into God's blueprint and live in the fullness of Grace today?

You are not a slave in Egypt. You are not wandering in the wilderness. You are standing in the Promised Land! Everything you need has already been given. Now, it's time to possess it. God's Grace was before the foundation of the world. He created you in His divine blueprint, and He has already established your path, your provision, and your victory. So walk in it. Live as one who is fully supplied. Build your life on the unshakable Rock of Christ. The Kingdom is here—and you are part of it.

Day 7: Deny Yourself, Take Up Your Cross, and Follow – Pages 31 to 35

<u>Brief</u>: In this section, we are faced with a direct challenge from Jesus Himself: "If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me." (Mark 8:34-35).

This call is not for the faint of heart—it is a radical invitation to surrender, to abandon self-reliance, and to fully trust Jesus as the only way, truth, and life.

Denying oneself does not mean suppressing your desires or ambitions in a legalistic way. Instead, it means surrendering your will entirely to Christ, allowing His desires, His mission, and His righteousness to become the focus of your life. The greatest paradox of all is that by losing your life for Jesus' sake, you actually find true life—the abundant, overflowing life of Grace.

Today, we will reflect deeply on what it means to truly lay everything down at Jesus' feet. Are you still trying to hold on to control? Have you given Him complete access to every part of your heart? The invitation today is to release everything into His hands and trust in His ABSOLUTE GOODNESS.

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Open with a time of reflection, asking: "What does it mean to deny ourselves in a world that tells us to do the opposite?" Read Mark 8:34-35, Matthew 6:33, and Philippians 4:13 aloud. Discuss the difference between self-denial and Christ-dependence. Are there areas in our lives where we are still trying to control the outcome instead of fully trusting Jesus? Encourage participants to identify one thing they are struggling to surrender to Jesus and commit to laying it at His feet today. Close in prayer, asking the Holy Spirit to reveal areas where self is still on the throne and to lead each person into true surrender.

"And He summoned the crowd with His disciples, and said to them, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake and the gospel's will save it."

Mark 8:34-35

"But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you."

Matthew 6:33

"I can do all things through Him who strengthens me." Philippians 4:13

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: Jesus is calling you to let go. To deny yourself means to release every ounce of self-reliance and fully depend on the Grace of God. The truth is, we cannot live this life in our own strength. We cannot fix ourselves. We cannot "try harder" to be righteous. Only in total surrender to Jesus can we truly be transformed.

Are you still trying to be in control? Maybe you say you trust Jesus, but deep down, you're afraid to fully release your dreams, your finances, your relationships, your future. The only way to experience the fullness of Grace is to stop striving and start trusting.

The cross is not a burden—it is freedom. It is the place where your old life dies, and the resurrected life of Christ is born in you. When Jesus tells us to take up our cross, He is inviting us into His victorious, Grace-filled, abundant life.

Today's challenge: Identify one thing you have been afraid to surrender. It might be your career, a broken relationship, an unmet expectation. Whatever it is, bring it before Jesus today. Pray and release it. Write it down as a declaration of surrender, and then leave it at the foot of the cross. The moment you let go, you make room for God's absolute GOODNESS to take over.

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: The ultimate example of denying oneself is RADICAL GENEROSITY. Jesus gave everything—His life, His glory, His very being—to reconcile us to the Father. When we live in the fullness of His Grace, generosity becomes our natural response. Here's how you can live radically generously today: Give away something valuable. Not just what's extra—give something that costs you. Maybe it's money, time, or even a cherished possession. Let this be an act of trust in God's provision.

Meet a need without being asked. Look for someone who is struggling and bless them—secretly, if possible. Radical generosity is most powerful when there is no expectation of return. Speak life over someone today. Encourage, uplift, and pour love into someone who needs it. Words of life are a powerful currency in the Kingdom.

How does it feel to give freely, expecting nothing in return? What does the act of RADICAL GENEROSITY teach you about God's heart?

#### 3 Challenge Questions:

- What does "denying yourself" practically look like in your daily life?
- Is there an area in your life where you are still struggling to trust Jesus completely? How can you surrender it today?
- How can you take up your cross daily in a way that brings glory to God?

Today is your opportunity to step into true surrender. Jesus is not asking you to carry a heavy burden—He is asking you to lay yours down. Will you trust Him completely? Will you deny yourself and follow Him into the fullness of Grace? The cross is the greatest symbol of radical love, radical Grace, and radical surrender. Carry it boldly. Walk in His victory. Lose yourself in His Grace, and you will find the life you were created for.

Day 8: Surrendering to God's Absolute Goodness – Pages 36 to 40

<u>Brief</u>: In this section of **THE Grace Awakening**, we dive deeper into ABSOLUTE SURRENDER—letting go of our own efforts and allowing God's ABSOLUTE GOODNESS to work in and through us. Many of us have spent years striving, trying to earn God's love or maintain a form of righteousness through our own works. But here, we are called to cease striving and instead rest in His finished work.

Grace is not a reward for effort; it is a gift freely given. The question is, have we truly received it? This passage calls us to a full and radical surrender, where we no longer live according to our own will, but fully yield ourselves to the Holy Spirit's leading. God's ABSOLUTE GOODNESS is not just an idea to believe in—it is the foundation of our faith, our identity, and our ability to live freely IN CHRIST.

Are you ready to let go of control and surrender completely to His Grace? Today, we break the cycle of striving and enter into the rest of God.

For Group Facilitators: Begin with Worship & Prayer: Encourage participants to invite the Holy Spirit to illuminate areas where they need to surrender. Read Ephesians 1:3, Romans 5:5-11, and Colossians 2:14 aloud. These verses reinforce THE TRUTH that God's Grace is absolute, and His goodness is unshakable. Ask participants: "Do you find yourself still striving for God's approval? What does surrendering to Grace look like in your life?" Discuss practical surrender: How can we live in complete dependence on Jesus daily? Encourage a symbolic act of surrender: Have participants write down one thing they have been striving for and physically release it by tearing it up, burning it, or leaving it at the foot of a cross (if available).

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places IN CHRIST," **Ephesians 1:3** 

"and hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out within our hearts through the Holy Spirit who was given to us. For while we were still helpless, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. For one will hardly die for a righteous man; though perhaps for the good man someone would dare even to die. But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from the wrath of God through Him. For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life. And not only this, but we also exult in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received the reconciliation." Romans 5:5-11

"having canceled out the certificate of debt consisting of decrees against us, which was hostile to us; and He has taken it out of the way, having nailed it to the cross." **Colossians 2:14** 

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: Jesus invites us to cease striving and rest in His ABSOLUTE GOODNESS. The battle is no longer ours—He has already won it. Yet, how often do we still try to fight on our own, proving ourselves, earning love, and striving for worth?

Grace is not a transaction; it is a transformation. God is not offering Grace in exchange for your good behavior. He is inviting you into His rest, where everything you need has already been provided.

Paul writes in Romans 5:9, "Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from the wrath of God through Him." There is no more wrath for those IN CHRIST—Jesus absorbed it all. There is no condemnation, no judgment, no fear left for you. So why do we live as though there is still something to prove?

What would it look like for you to truly rest in God's ABSOLUTE GOODNESS?

- Stop trying to earn what Jesus already paid for.
- Let go of the pressure to "be good enough"—you already are IN CHRIST.
- Receive Grace as a free gift, not as a paycheck.
- Stop focusing on your faithfulness—focus on His faithfulness.

Surrender is not weakness; it is the greatest strength in the Kingdom. It is the place where God's power flows freely. Today, let go. Surrender to His ABSOLUTE GOODNESS.

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: Freely you have received; freely give. Since Grace is entirely unearned, let's practice RADICAL GENEROSITY in a way that reflects the ABSOLUTE GOODNESS of God. Cancel a debt. Whether financial or emotional, forgive someone freely—just as you have been forgiven. Give extravagantly to someone who can never repay you. Let your generosity be a reflection of God's goodness, not an expectation of return. Bless someone who doesn't deserve it. Grace is radical—it goes to those who least expect it because they don't deserve it. Find a way to shock someone with kindness today.

How does your generosity deepen your awareness of God's Grace? How does it free you to trust in His provision?

#### 3 Challenge Questions:

- What areas of your life are still marked by striving rather than surrender?
- Do you truly believe that God's Grace is enough for you, or are you still trying to prove yourself?
- How can you live in God's rest daily, trusting in His ABSOLUTE GOODNESS rather than your own efforts?

Surrendering to Grace is not a one-time event—it is a daily decision to trust Jesus completely. Today, let go. Live as one who is already fully loved, fully forgiven, and fully supplied by God's ABSOLUTE GOODNESS.

# Day 9: Awakening to God's Absolute GOODNESS – Pages 41 to 45

<u>Brief</u>: This segment of **THE Grace Awakening** lays a crucial foundation, not just for understanding Grace but for truly embodying THE TRUTH of Jesus Christ in our daily lives. It emphasizes the absolute necessity of implanting God's Word deeply within our hearts. This section highlights that Grace is not just a concept—it is a lived experience, meant to be woven into the fabric of our lives minute by minute. The transformation from knowing Grace to living in Grace is only possible by believing Jesus, soaking in the Word, meditating on the Lord's ABSOLUTE GOODNESS, and allowing the Holy Spirit to work from within.

God's Grace is the bedrock of His Salvation, an undeserved gift that continuously supplies all that we need IN CHRIST. The invitation in these pages is not merely to read about Grace, but to encounter Jesus, receiving the revelation of His GOODNESS and stepping into the fullness of His Grace. As you begin your journey today, ask yourself: *Am I truly living in the fullness of God's Grace, or am I holding on to old beliefs, fears, or religious burdens?* 

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Open with a time of prayer, inviting the Holy Spirit to reveal God's absolute GOODNESS. Read aloud Psalms 23:6, Psalms 25:7, and Ephesians 1:18—these Scriptures set the tone for today's study. Encourage each participant to reflect on how God's GOODNESS has been evident in their lives. Discuss the importance of receiving Grace rather than striving for it. Ask each participant to consider: What does it mean to be fully justified by Grace? Perhaps offer up a moment of silent reflection SEEKING HIM, allowing the Holy Spirit to minister deeply.

"Surely goodness and lovingkindness will follow me all the days of my life, And I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever." **Psalms 23:6** 

"Do not remember the sins of my youth or my transgressions; According to Your lovingkindness remember me, For Your goodness' sake, O Lord." **Psalms 25:7** 

"I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened, so that you will know what is the hope of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints," **Ephesians 1:18** 

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: God's absolute GOODNESS is the foundation of this study. His Grace is not something we earn—it is freely given and must be received with an open heart. In this segment, you are invited to embrace Grace as a lifestyle, not as a religious theory. If you are struggling with fear, self-doubt, or feelings of inadequacy, pause and ask: "Have I truly asked for and received the Father's Grace in Jesus name?"

Jesus did not come to partially save you; He came to remove every hindrance between you and the Father. You are fully justified by His blood. There is no more wrath against you. All condemnation was nailed to the Cross. Can you grasp the depth of this reality? If not, ask Jesus to help you receive it today BY GRACE.

Let's take this deeper—What is holding you back from fully receiving Grace? Are there areas in your life where you still feel like you must "prove" yourself to God? Lay them at Jesus' feet. He has already provided everything you need by Grace.

Before you move on, take five minutes and pray aloud, thanking Jesus for His absolute GOODNESS. If you feel any hesitation in receiving this truth, confess it to Him and ask the Holy Spirit to renew your mind with the revelation of God's GOODNESS.

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: The GOODNESS of God is an invitation to give as freely as we have received. Today, step out in RADICAL GENEROSITY by demonstrating God's GOODNESS in a tangible way. Here are three ways you can do this:

- Buy someone a meal with no expectation of repayment—demonstrate God's free Grace through generosity.
- Forgive a debt, whether financial or emotional—set someone free just as Christ has set you free.
- Share your testimony of God's Grace with someone who needs encouragement—spread His GOODNESS by telling of His love.

How does giving generously change you? Do you experience a greater awareness of God's Grace when you give freely?

#### 3 Challenge Questions:

- How do you personally define God's absolute GOODNESS, and how does that shape your faith?
- Are there areas of your life where you still struggle to receive Grace fully? What steps can you take today to surrender them to Jesus?
- How does knowing that God's wrath has been completely removed change your relationship with Him?

Today's lesson is an awakening to the reality of God's GOODNESS. He is not just kind—He is radically, extravagantly good. His Grace is abundant, free, and unending. Walk in this truth today, and let it transform the way you see yourself, others, and your purpose in the Kingdom!

Day 10: The Battle for Your Heart – Pages 46 to 50

<u>Brief</u>: There is an enemy. He is real, and he wants your heart. The battle between good and evil is ultimately a battle for the human heart. Every thought, decision, and belief is either aligned with God's truth or a deception from the enemy. The Word of God is clear: apart from Christ, we were enemies of God, but now, through Jesus' finished work, we are reconciled, redeemed, and victorious. Yet, the battle is not over—not for our salvation, but for our faith, our confidence, and our willingness to stand firm IN CHRIST. The enemy seeks to distort what is good and make us doubt God's ABSOLUTE GOODNESS. But THE TRUTH is this:

- Salvation is a free gift of Grace. (Ephesians 2:8-9)
- We have been made righteous through Christ's finished work. (Romans 3:23-24)
- God's wrath is fully satisfied in Jesus. (Romans 5:9)
- Faith happens in the heart. (Romans 10:10)

"For by Grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; not as a result of works, so that no one may boast." **Ephesians 2:9** 

for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, being justified as a gift by His Grace through the redemption which is IN CHRIST Jesus;" **Romans 3:24** 

"Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from the wrath of God through Him." **Romans 5:9** 

"for with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation." **Romans 10:10** 

Everything comes down to the battle for our hearts and minds—a battle over who gets to define what is good: God or man.

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Open with Romans 10:8-13 and ask: Do you fully believe in your heart that you are saved, righteous, and reconciled to God? Discuss how spiritual warfare is really a battle of faith in God's goodness versus the lies of the enemy. Challenge participants to identify any areas where they are still living as though they are "enemies" of God, even though He has fully reconciled them. Close with a declaration of God's goodness and victory over every lie and deception.

"But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart"—that is, the word of faith which we are preaching, that if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved; for with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation. For the Scripture says, "Whoever believes in Him will not be disappointed." For there

is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same Lord is Lord of all, abounding in riches for all who call on Him; for "Whoever will call on the name of the Lord will be saved."

Romans 10:8-13

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: Do not be fooled—there is an enemy, and he is after your heart. He is not after your possessions, your job, or even your health as much as he is after your belief in God's goodness.

"Now the serpent was more crafty than any beast of the field which the Lord God had made.

And he said to the woman, "Indeed, has God said, 'You shall not eat from any tree of the garden'?" **Genesis 3:1** 

Think about it: from the very beginning, the serpent's strategy was to make Adam and Eve doubt God's goodness. He didn't attack them physically—he attacked their faith in God's character. "Did God really say...?" (Genesis 3:1) Satan has no new tricks. He still works the same way—by distorting who God is and who we are IN CHRIST. But here's THE TRUTH:

- Jesus paid it all. You are no longer an enemy of God—you are seated with Christ in heavenly places (Ephesians 2:6).
- God's wrath is finished. There is no more judgment for those IN CHRIST—only Grace, love, and unshakable security (Romans 8:1).
- Faith happens in the heart. It's not about works, striving, or religious rituals—it's about believing and receiving the free gift of righteousness (Romans 10:9-10).

"and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places IN CHRIST Jesus,"

Ephesians 2:6

"Therefore there is now no condemnation for those who are IN CHRIST Jesus." Romans 8:1

"that if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved; for with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation." **Romans 10:9-10** 

"And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect."

Romans 12:2

So, where does the battle take place? In your mind. Every lie of the enemy is designed to keep you from fully living in Grace. This is why the Bible commands us to renew our minds (Romans 12:2). Jesus already won the war—but you must fight to keep your heart rooted in His truth.

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: Radical generosity begins with trusting in God's GOODNESS. If you believe that God is truly good, you will live open-handedly, knowing He provides everything you need. Today, practice RADICAL GENEROSITY by:

- Giving freely—bless someone without hesitation.
- Speaking truth—encourage someone who is struggling with doubt or fear.
- Interceding in prayer—stand in the gap for someone caught in deception.
- Surrendering control—fully trust that God will take care of your needs as you take care of others.

The enemy wants you to fear lack—but RADICAL GENEROSITY proves that your faith is in God's abundant Grace!

#### 3 Challenge Questions:

- Are you fully convinced that God is good, or do you still wrestle with doubt?
- Where has the enemy tried to make you believe that you are still an "enemy" of God, even though Jesus already reconciled you?
- What radical act of generosity can you do today that proves you fully trust God's abundant goodness?

The enemy has already been defeated—but he will do everything in his power to keep you from believing it. Stand firm in THE TRUTH: Jesus is victorious, and you are victorious IN HIM!

# Day 11: The Battle for Our Hearts – Guarding the Imagination - Pages 51 to 55

<u>Brief:</u> There is only one true battlefield in the universe: the human heart. Everything—faith, sin, fear, and righteousness—flows from the imagination and desires of the heart. Jesus taught that sin begins in the heart before it ever manifests outwardly. This is why the enemy's primary strategy is to corrupt the imagination, leading people to doubt God's GOODNESS and fall into deception.

The only defense against this battle is the Word of God. The Bible repeatedly commands us to guard our hearts and renew our minds because the enemy constantly seeks to plant lies in our thought life. But through Grace, we have been given the righteousness of Christ, empowering us to walk in purity, faith, and truth.

"Watch over your heart with all diligence, for from it flow the springs of life." Proverbs 4:23

This section of **THE Grace Awakening** calls us to actively guard our hearts and minds, filling them with truth, righteousness, and the Grace of God.

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Start with John 14:1 and ask: What does it mean to guard your heart? Discuss the reality that sin starts in the imagination before it ever manifests outwardly. Challenge the group to identify where the enemy has attempted to plant doubt, fear, or deception in their hearts. Lead a discussion on the difference between faith-filled imagination and fear-based imagination. Encourage each participant to commit to renewing their mind daily through the Word of God.

"Do not let your heart be troubled; believe in God, believe also in Me." John 14:1

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: Jesus never allowed sin to enter His heart. He never once entertained deception, lust, or pride in His imagination. He only knew God's ABSOLUTE GOODNESS, and because of that, He walked in perfect righteousness.

"He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." **2 Corinthians 5:21** 

This same righteousness has now been given to us through Christ! If we have been made righteous by Grace, then why do we still struggle with sin? Because the battlefield is in our minds. The devil's only weapon is deception—getting us to believe a lie instead of THE TRUTH.

The enemy wages war by planting doubt, fear, lust, and pride in our thoughts. But the Word of God is our defense—it is the sword that cuts through deception and fills our hearts with truth, faith, and power.

"Sanctify them in THE TRUTH; Your word is TRUTH." John 17:17

The battle is not external—it is fought and won in the heart. If we allow fear, lust, or doubt to grow in our imagination, we will eventually act on it. But if we fill our hearts with THE TRUTH of God's Word, we will walk in the fullness of Christ's righteousness.

"And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect."

Romans 12:2

Jesus commanded us to guard our hearts diligently because the enemy's goal is to corrupt our imagination and turn us away from truth.

"Do not let your heart be troubled; believe in God, believe also in Me." John 14:1

Victory begins when we choose to reject the lies of the enemy and receive THE TRUTH by faith.

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: The most powerful form of generosity is to give someone THE TRUTH. The enemy thrives on deception, so one of the greatest gifts we can give is to help someone break free from the lies that have held them captive. Today's challenge:

- Identify someone who is struggling with doubt, fear, or condemnation.
- Speak truth over them. Share a Scripture that reveals God's goodness, love, and righteousness.
- Encourage someone to renew their mind daily—offer to read the Word with them.
- Pray with someone who is battling deception and ask the Holy Spirit to reveal truth to them.
- Declare truth over yourself—write down a list of God's promises and speak them aloud.

"Set your minds on the things that are above, not on the things that are on earth." **Colossians** 3:2

Generosity is not just about money—it is about giving people THE TRUTH that sets them free.

# 3 Challenge Questions:

- Where has the enemy tried to plant deception in your heart?
- What steps can you take to guard your heart and renew your mind daily?
- Who in your life needs to hear THE TRUTH of God's Grace today?

The battle is already won—but we must stand in victory by keeping our hearts ROOTED IN TRUTH, faith, and righteousness. DAILY READ AND SOAK IN THE WORD OF GOD, YOUR BIBLE. The enemy has no power over those who are fully convinced of God's GOODNESS and righteousness, especially those who are FILLED BY GRACE.

Jesus has already defeated the enemy—now, guard your heart and walk in that victory!

Day 12: Grace is the Air of Heaven – Breathe It In! Pages 56 to 60

**Brief**: Grace is not just an idea or a concept—it is the very air of Heaven. Just as we cannot live without oxygen, we cannot truly live without the Grace of God. Grace is God's unlimited, unearned supply of His ABSOLUTE GOODNESS, freely given to us through Jesus Christ.

Many BELIEVERS still live as though they are striving for God's favor, but THE TRUTH is that we already have it. Grace is the substance of Heaven—it is the power that fuels our lives and transforms us from the inside out. Today's study challenges us to breathe in God's Grace daily, to rely on it completely, and to allow it to sustain us in every area of life.

"For if by the transgression of the one, death reigned through the one, much more those who RECEIVE <u>THE ABUNDANCE OF GRACE</u> AND <u>THE GIFT OF RIGHTEOUSNESS</u> WILL REIGN IN LIFE THROUGH THE ONE, JESUS CHRIST." Romans 5:17

Are you breathing in Grace, or are you still striving?

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Start with Ephesians 2:4-6 and ask: What does it mean to be "seated with Christ" in heavenly places? Encourage the group to share ways in which they have tried to "earn" God's favor instead of simply receiving His Grace. Discuss the idea that Grace is the air of Heaven—something we were meant to live by, moment by moment. Challenge participants to practice receiving Grace instead of striving. Close by praying for a greater revelation of God's unlimited Grace and supply.

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: We were never meant to live in our own strength. Just as oxygen fuels our bodies, Grace fuels our spiritual lives. Without it, we will constantly struggle, striving to please God through our own efforts. Jesus came FULL OF GRACE AND TRUTH, and now we are called to live by that same Grace.

"For of His fullness we have all received, and Grace upon Grace." John 1:16

Imagine breathing in Grace the same way you breathe in oxygen. Every time you inhale, receive THE TRUTH of God's ABSOLUTE GOODNESS. Every time you exhale, let go of striving, fear, and self-effort.

- Grace is your power source. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit apart from the vine, you cannot produce anything of eternal value apart from God's Grace. (**John 15:5**)
- Grace sustains you. It is not a one-time experience—it is a constant supply that must be received daily, FOREVER. (2 Corinthians 12:9)
- Grace empowers you to reign. You were never meant to live in defeat—you are called to reign in life through Jesus Christ! (Romans 5:17)
- Grace is unlimited. Just like the air you breathe, there is no shortage of Grace! It is always available for those who receive it. (1 Peter 1:13)

Jesus never struggled to receive His Father's love. He lived in a constant awareness of His Father's Grace. Now, we are invited to do the same!

"For in Him we live and move and exist, as even some of your own poets have said, 'For we also are His descendants." **Acts 17:28** 

"But God, being rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, made us alive together with Christ (by Grace you have been saved), and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places IN CHRIST Jesus," **Ephesians 2:4-6** 

"I am the vine, you are the branches; he who abides in Me and I in him, he bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing." **John 15:5** 

"And He has said to me, "My Grace is sufficient for you, for power is perfected in weakness."

Most gladly, therefore, I will rather boast about my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me." 2 Corinthians 12:9

"For if by the transgression of the one, death reigned through the one, much more those who receive the abundance of Grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the One, Jesus Christ." **Romans 5:17** 

"Therefore, prepare your minds for action, keep sober in spirit, fix your hope completely on the Grace to be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ." **1 Peter 1:13** 

The key to living in Grace is to rest in the finished work of Jesus. When we stop striving, we can finally experience the supernatural life God intended for us!

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: One of the greatest ways to live by Grace is to extend Grace to others. Today, challenge yourself to demonstrate RADICAL GENEROSITY by giving away something valuable.

- Forgive someone completely—no strings attached.
- Give your time and energy to someone who needs encouragement.
- Meet a practical need—buy groceries for someone, help a struggling friend, or bless a stranger.
- Speak life over someone—declare God's Grace, favor, and goodness over their lives.
- Release control—surrender a problem or burden to Jesus and stop trying to fix it in your own strength.

"Jesus answered and said to her, 'If you knew the gift of God, and who it is who is saying to you, "Give Me a drink," you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water."

John 4:10

Grace is God's unearned favor. When we freely receive it, we can freely give it to others.

#### 3 Challenge Questions:

- Are you living by Grace, or are you still striving? What areas of your life need to be surrendered to Grace?
- How can you remind yourself daily to "breathe in" God's Grace and rely on it completely?
- What radical act of generosity can you do today to extend the same Grace you have received?

Grace is not just a one-time experience—it is the breath of Heaven. Just as we rely on oxygen to live, we must rely on Grace to thrive. Jesus came to bring us abundant life, not religious striving. Take a deep breath and receive His unlimited Grace today!

Day 13: The Power of God's Grace in Your Life - Pages 61 to 65

<u>Brief:</u> God's Grace is more than just forgiveness—it is the power of God at work within us. Grace is what sustains, strengthens, and empowers us to live as true disciples of Jesus Christ. The Bible declares that those who receive the abundance of Grace and the gift of righteousness will reign in life through Jesus (Romans 5:17).

"For if by the transgression of the one, death reigned through the one, much more those who receive the abundance of Grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the One, Jesus Christ." **Romans 5:17** 

The key is receiving His Grace—not just once, but continually. Just as we breathe in oxygen every moment to stay alive, we must constantly breathe in the Grace of God to live victoriously IN CHRIST. Today's focus is on what it means to walk in the fullness of His Grace, no longer striving, no longer fearful, but living in the confidence and power of His finished work.

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Open with John 1:16: "For from His fullness we have all received, Grace upon Grace." Ask: What does it mean to receive the fullness of Grace? Discuss Romans 5:17: What does it look like to reign in life through Jesus? Challenge the group to identify areas where they have been striving instead of resting in God's Grace. Encourage participants to practice a simple daily exercise of receiving Grace with every breath—a reminder that they live by His

supply, not their own effort. Close in prayer, thanking God for the endless supply of Grace available to His children.

"For of His fullness we have all received, and GRACE UPON GRACE." John 1:16

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: Are you breathing in Grace? Or are you still striving to earn what God has already given? Imagine standing before Jesus at His Throne of Grace, fully confident that you belong in His presence. You are not there by your own works, but by the finished work of Christ. This is the reality of the believer's life—we are seated in heavenly places, fully accepted, fully loved, fully empowered.

"For by Grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God." **Ephesians 2:8** 

Jesus is not asking you to work harder—He is asking you to receive. Grace is the oxygen of the Kingdom of God, and you were designed to breathe it in continually. Think about this:

- Grace is unlimited—there is always more.
- Grace is empowering—it gives us strength beyond our own abilities.
- Grace is our confidence—we don't live in fear or doubt.
- Grace is our rest—we stop striving and trust in His supply.

Jesus is calling you to live by His Grace, not by your own effort. Breathe it in. Receive it. Let it transform every part of your life. The moment you stop trying to be enough in your own strength, His power is made perfect in you.

"And He has said to me, 'My Grace is sufficient for you, for power is perfected in weakness.'
Most gladly, therefore, I will rather boast about my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may
dwell in me." 2 Corinthians 12:9

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: Living by Grace means living with open hands. If we truly believe that God's supply never runs out, then we can live without fear, without hoarding, without selfishness. Today's challenge:

- Give something valuable away—something that costs you.
- Speak life over someone who is discouraged—encourage them in THE TRUTH of Grace.
- Let go of control—trust that God's Grace is sufficient for you.

• Bless someone in a tangible way—a meal, a financial gift, or an act of kindness.

Generosity is a response to the Grace we have received. The more we understand His supply, the more freely we will give.

"Jesus answered and said to her, 'If you knew the gift of God... you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water." **John 4:10** 

#### 3 Challenge Questions:

- Are you truly receiving the fullness of God's Grace, or are you still striving?
- Where have you been living in lack instead of trusting in God's supply?
- How can you demonstrate RADICAL GENEROSITY today as an overflow of Grace?

Grace is the breath of Heaven. You were never meant to live without it. Stop striving, stop doubting, stop holding back—breathe in the fullness of Christ. He is your supply, your confidence, your rest. Jesus came to give abundant life, not religious striving. Take a deep breath, receive His Grace, and walk in His fullness today!

Heavenly Father, I thank You for the abundance of Your Grace. I surrender my striving, my fear, and my self-effort. Teach me to live by Your supply, not my own. Fill me with Your presence, empower me with Your Spirit, and let my life overflow with Your love and generosity. I receive Your Grace fully, completely, and joyfully. In Jesus' name, Amen!

# Day 14: The Kingdom of God and His Righteousness - Pages 66 to 70

<u>Brief</u>: God's Grace calls us to seek first His Kingdom and His righteousness (Matthew 6:33). This means shifting our focus from temporary concerns to eternal realities, from self-sufficiency to God's sufficiency.

"But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you."

Matthew 6:33

The Kingdom of God is not a far-off concept—it is here and now, operating through those who walk by faith IN CHRIST. True righteousness is not earned by human effort—it is a free gift given by Jesus Christ through His finished work on the Cross.

Many attempt to establish their own righteousness through works, but true righteousness is only received by faith. When we understand that we are already made righteous, we can walk in the fullness of God's Kingdom, bringing transformation to every area of our lives.

"For the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking, but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit." **Romans 14:17** 

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Begin with Matthew 6:33: What does it mean to seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness? Read Romans 10:3-4: How do people try to establish their own righteousness instead of receiving Christ's?

"For not knowing about God's righteousness and seeking to establish their own, they did not subject themselves to the righteousness of God. For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes." **Romans 10:3-4** 

Discuss the practical ways we can live as Kingdom ambassadors in our daily lives. Encourage participants to reflect on whether they are truly walking in God's righteousness or still striving for their own. Pray together, asking God to reveal the fullness of His Kingdom and remove any self-righteousness that hinders His work in our lives.

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: The Kingdom of God is not about rules and rituals—it is about living by the Spirit, walking in righteousness, peace, and joy. The world seeks after temporary things—money, success, approval—but Jesus calls us to seek first His Kingdom.

"But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you."

Matthew 6:33

Jesus is saying, "Shift your focus." Instead of chasing after what the world values, pursue the things of Heaven. When we prioritize His Kingdom, He promises that everything else will be taken care of. But what does it mean to seek His righteousness? Many people believe that righteousness is something we must achieve by being good enough, trying harder, and avoiding sin. But righteousness is a gift!

"For not knowing about God's righteousness and seeking to establish their own, they did not subject themselves to the righteousness of God." **Romans 10:3** 

Trying to earn righteousness is like trying to buy something that has already been given to you for free. Jesus already made us righteous through His death and resurrection. Our role is not to earn it—it is to receive it, believe it, and walk in it.

"even when we were dead in our transgressions, made us alive together with Christ (by Grace you have been saved), and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places IN CHRIST Jesus." **Ephesians 2:5-6** 

You are already seated with Christ in heavenly places! You are already righteous! So, why do we often struggle to believe it? The enemy constantly whispers lies of unworthiness, trying to convince us that we must still earn God's approval. But THE TRUTH is simple:

- You don't have to fight for what is already yours IN CHRIST.
- Jesus gave us His righteousness as a free gift, and now we are called to live in it and extend His Kingdom on the earth.

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: When we truly understand that we have been given everything IN CHRIST, we can freely give to others without fear of lack. Today's challenge:

- Be radically generous with your time. Spend intentional, uninterrupted time serving or encouraging someone.
- Give something valuable away. Whether it's a financial gift, a meaningful possession, or an act of service—give as Jesus gives.
- Forgive someone fully. Release any resentment or bitterness and extend the same Grace you have received.
- Speak life over someone today. Call out God's righteousness in them, reminding them of who they are IN CHRIST.

"Give, and it will be given to you. They will pour into your lap a good measure—pressed down, shaken together, and running over. For by your standard of measure it will be measured to you in return." **Luke 6:38** 

When we seek first the Kingdom of God, we become overflowing vessels of His Grace and generosity.

#### 3 Challenge Questions:

- Are you truly seeking first the Kingdom of God, or are you still seeking after temporary things?
- Have you fully received Christ's righteousness, or are you still trying to earn God's approval?
- How can you live out the reality of God's Kingdom today in your home, workplace, and community?

You are already seated with Christ in heavenly places. You are already made righteous through His finished work. Stop striving, stop doubting, and start walking in the fullness of His Kingdom. Jesus said, "Seek first His Kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." That is a promise. When you live by Grace, trusting in His supply, you will lack nothing. God has called you to be an ambassador of His Kingdom—so go today and live as a citizen of Heaven, bringing His righteousness to the world!

Heavenly Father, I surrender all self-effort and striving. Teach me to truly seek first Your Kingdom and Your righteousness. I receive the gift of righteousness through Jesus Christ, and I walk in the full assurance that I am loved, accepted, and seated with You in heavenly places. Let my life be an overflow of Your Kingdom generosity, and let me be a living testimony of Your Grace. In Jesus' name, Amen!

Day 15: The Grace Space – Pages 71 to 74

<u>Brief</u>: The Grace Space is the realm of unbroken fellowship with God, where BELIEVERS live in the fullness of God's presence, provision, and power. In this space, we are no longer striving but resting IN CHRIST's finished work.

"Now to Him who is able to do far more abundantly beyond all that we ask or think, according to the power that works WITHIN US, to Him be the glory in the church and IN CHRIST Jesus to all generations forever and ever. Amen." **Ephesians 3:20-21** 

This segment highlights how right believing fuels right living. Just as having the wrong map leads to lost directions, having wrong beliefs about God, salvation, and righteousness leads to spiritual wandering. The Grace Space is where we encounter Jesus moment by moment, embracing His ABSOLUTE GOODNESS and living in continuous communion with the Holy Spirit.

"For the Grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all men." Titus 2:11

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Open in prayer: Ask God to remove any wrong beliefs and replace them with THE TRUTH of His Word. Discuss the concept of "The Grace Space": What does it mean to live in unceasing fellowship with God? Read Ephesians 2:5-10 together: What does it mean that we are already seated with Christ? How does this affect our daily lives? Share testimonies: Have participants share experiences of times they felt God's unbroken presence in their lives. Challenge participants to evaluate their beliefs: Are they walking in Grace and faith or still striving for righteousness? Close with a declaration: Speak out loud the reality of who we are IN CHRIST, thanking God for His ongoing intercession for us (Romans 8:34, Hebrews 7:25).

"even when we were dead in our transgressions, made us alive together with Christ (by Grace you have been saved), and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places IN CHRIST Jesus, so that in the ages to come He might show the surpassing riches of His Grace in kindness toward us IN CHRIST Jesus. For by Grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; 9not as a result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are His workmanship, created IN CHRIST Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them." **Ephesians 2:5-10** 

"who is the one who condemns? Christ Jesus is He who died, yes, rather who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who also intercedes for us." **Romans 8:34** 

"Therefore He is able also to save forever those who draw near to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them." **Hebrews 7:25** 

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: The biggest battle in our lives is the battle for our hearts and minds—what we believe about God, ourselves, and our identity IN CHRIST. The enemy's greatest deception is wrong believing. Imagine being sent on an important mission with the wrong map. No matter how hard you try, you won't reach the right destination. This is why RIGHT BELIEVING IS EVERYTHING!

"For with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation." **Romans 10:10** 

If you have wrong beliefs about God, you will struggle to walk in faith and authority. But the Grace Space—where we abide IN CHRIST's finished work—sets us free from striving and fear. The Grace Space is where we:

- Rest IN CHRIST's intercession for us (Romans 8:34)
- Live in unceasing communion with the Trinity (1 Thessalonians 5:23-24)
- Walk in the surpassing riches of His Grace (Ephesians 2:5-10)
- Experience supernatural transformation (Romans 12:2)

"Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you entirely; and may your spirit and soul and body be preserved complete, without blame at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. Faithful is He who calls you, and He also will bring it to pass." 1 Thessalonians 5:23-24

"And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect."

Romans 12:2

The question is: Are you living in the Grace Space, or are you still trying to earn what Jesus already freely gave?

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: When we understand that everything we have is by Grace, generosity flows naturally. Today's challenge:

• Give away something valuable. A possession, a financial gift, or an act of service—give with no expectation of return.

- Invest time in intercession. Since Jesus and the Holy Spirit are interceding for us (Romans 8:26-27, Hebrews 7:24-25), join them! Pray for someone today.
- Radically encourage someone. Speak life into someone who is struggling—remind them of their identity IN CHRIST.
- Forgive freely. Release any offense you have toward someone. Grace flows through forgiveness.

"In the same way the Spirit also helps our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we should, but the Spirit Himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words; and He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit is, because He intercedes for the saints according to the will of God." **Romans 8:26-27** 

"but Jesus, on the other hand, because He continues forever, holds His priesthood permanently.

Therefore He is able also to save forever those who draw near to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them." **Hebrews 7:24-25** 

When you live in the Grace Space, generosity becomes your lifestyle!

## 3 Challenge Questions:

- Are you living in unbroken fellowship with Jesus, or do you still struggle with striving and self-effort?
- What areas of your life need to come under THE TRUTH of God's Word so that you can walk in right believing?
- How can you practically walk in the Grace Space today?

"Give, and it will be given to you. They will pour into your lap a good measure—pressed down, shaken together, and running over." **Luke 6:38** 

The Grace Space is not a concept—it is your reality IN CHRIST. You don't have to strive, work harder, or prove yourself. Jesus already did it all! Now, abide in Him, believe His Word, and live in the fullness of Grace.

"but Jesus, on the other hand, because He continues forever, holds His priesthood permanently.

Therefore He is able also to SAVE FOREVER those who draw near to God through Him, since

HE ALWAYS LIVES to make INTERCESSION for them." **Hebrews 7:24-25** 

The Trinity is always interceding for you—you are never alone, never abandoned, and never powerless! Live today in the Grace Space, in Jesus' name!

# Day 16: Right Believing – The Right Map and Address - Pages 75-80

<u>Brief</u>: In this segment, we see how right believing is everything. Just like trying to find a location in Chicago using a map of Detroit, many BELIEVERS are operating with the wrong information—believing lies instead of truth. If our spiritual foundation is built on wrong beliefs, we will struggle in our faith walk. The key to success in this life and the one to come is having the right information—THE TRUTH of God's Word. BELIEVERS must understand that they are already the righteousness of God IN CHRIST (2 Corinthians 5:21). The moment we receive His righteousness by faith, we step into right believing, which leads to right thinking and right living.

"He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the RIGHTEOUSNESS OF GOD IN CHRIST." **2 Corinthians 5:21** 

<u>For Group Facilitators:</u> Start with a simple question: Have you ever tried to complete a task with the wrong instructions or wrong information? What happened? Discuss the "map" analogy: Why is it important to have the right map (truth) and the right address (identity IN CHRIST) when navigating life? Read Ephesians 2:4-10: What does this passage say about our position IN CHRIST? How does knowing our identity impact our daily walk? Ask participants to reflect: Are they operating with right believing, or have they unknowingly been following wrong beliefs about God, themselves, and salvation? Pray for revelation: Ask God to replace wrong thinking with His truth and lead participants into the fullness of Grace and righteousness.

"But God, being rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, made us alive together with Christ (by Grace you have been saved), and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places IN CHRIST Jesus, so that in the ages to come He might show the surpassing riches of His Grace in kindness toward us IN CHRIST Jesus. For by Grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; not as a result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are His workmanship, created IN CHRIST Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them." **Ephesians 2:4-10** 

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: Imagine being assigned an urgent delivery with an incorrect address and the wrong city map. No matter how sincere or hard you try, you will never reach the correct destination. This is what happens when we believe wrong about God and our identity. Right believing is essential because:

- Right Believing → Right Thinking → Right Living → Right Results
- If we believe we are righteous IN CHRIST, we live in freedom and power

• If we believe we are stuck unforgiving sinners, we live in fear, guilt, and defeat If we trust in our works, we fall from Grace (Galatians 5:4)

"You have been severed from Christ, you who are seeking to be justified by law; you have fallen from Grace." **Galatians 5:4** 

### The Truth:

- You are the righteousness of God IN CHRIST (2 Corinthians 5:21).
- You have already been seated with Christ in heavenly places (Ephesians 2:6).
- You lack nothing because God has provided everything IN CHRIST (Philippians 4:19).
- You cannot earn God's love; you already have it fully (Romans 5:8).

"He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the RIGHTEOUSNESS OF GOD IN CHRIST." **2 Corinthians 5:21** 

"and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places IN CHRIST Jesus,"

Ephesians 2:6

"And my God will supply all your needs according to His riches in glory IN CHRIST Jesus."

Philippians 4:19

"But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." **Romans 5:8** 

What map are you using? The map of religion and self-effort or the map of Grace and Christ's finished work? If you are not living in joy, peace, and victory, it may be time to check your beliefs.

"For IN CHRIST Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision means anything, BUT FAITH WORKING THROUGH LOVE." — **Galatians 5:6** 

### **RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive**:

- Today's act of RADICAL GENEROSITY is to share the RIGHT MAP with someone.
- Identify one person who may be struggling with wrong beliefs about God, their identity, or salvation.
- Encourage them with Scripture, sharing THE TRUTH about who they are IN CHRIST.

- Pray for them, asking God to open their eyes to THE TRUTH.
- Give a small gift (a book, a note of encouragement, or a meal) as a symbol of God's generosity toward them.
- Be a guide, not a judge—we all needed someone to show us the right map!

"All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for TRAINING IN RIGHTEOUSNESS." — 2 Timothy 3:16

# 3 Challenge Questions:

- Have you been unknowingly following the wrong "map" in any area of your life? What beliefs about yourself or God need correction?
- Do you fully believe that you are the righteousness of God IN CHRIST? If not, what is holding you back?
- Who in your life is using the wrong spiritual map, and how can you help them discover THE TRUTH?

Father, thank You for showing me THE TRUTH of who I am IN CHRIST. I surrender every wrong belief and ask You to align my thoughts with Your Word. Help me walk in the fullness of Your Grace and share the right map with others. In Jesus' name, Amen!

# Day 17: RIGHT BELIEVING - Pages 81 to 85

<u>Brief.</u> Day 17 of THE Grace Awakening focuses on the transformative power of Right Believing and how it aligns us with the righteousness of God IN CHRIST. This section emphasizes that BELIEVERS are no longer identified IN ADAM—enslaved to sin and separated from righteousness—but have been transformed by Grace into a new creation, now fully alive and reigning in righteousness. Our righteousness is not earned; it is received as a gift from God. The moment we place our faith IN CHRIST, we are made righteous—not partially, not temporarily, but NOW and FOREVER. This truth liberates us from performance-based Christianity and calls us into a radical trust in the Grace of God. Key Scriptures:

"For as IN ADAM all die, so also IN CHRIST all will be made alive." 1 Corinthians 15:21-22

"Those who RECEIVE the ABUNDANCE OF GRACE and the GIFT OF RIGHTEOUSNESS WILL REIGN IN LIFE through the One, JESUS CHRIST." Romans 5:17

"So that, as SIN REIGNED IN DEATH, even so GRACE WOULD REIGN through RIGHTEOUSNESS to eternal life through JESUS CHRIST our Lord." Romans 5:21

"Jesus answered, 'My kingdom is not of this world..." John 18:36

Right Believing means fully accepting our new identity IN CHRIST, embracing Grace, and rejecting any attempt to add human effort to God's finished work.

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Guide your group into a deep reflection on what it means to REIGN in life through the gift of righteousness. Encourage discussion on how belief systems shape identity and how Right Believing produces Right Living. Discussion Prompts:

- What does it mean to be no longer IN ADAM but fully IN CHRIST?
- How does understanding righteousness as a gift transform our walk with God?
- Why is Right Believing essential to experiencing the fullness of Grace?

Encourage transparency, allowing participants to express their struggles with receiving God's righteousness apart from works. Reinforce that Grace reigns through righteousness, not through human performance.

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: RIGHT BELIEVING = RIGHTEOUSNESS NOW & FOREVER. The righteousness we receive IN CHRIST is immediate and eternal. It cannot be lost because it is rooted in God's faithfulness, not ours. Right Believing aligns our thoughts, emotions, and actions with God's truth by Grace working through His love.

"So that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; and that you, being rooted and grounded in love, may be able to comprehend... the love of Christ which surpasses knowledge."

# **Ephesians 3:17-19**

The Shift from IN ADAM to IN CHRIST:

IN ADAM: Separated from God, enslaved to sin.
IN CHRIST: Fully alive, reigning in righteousness.
IN ADAM: Subject to sin's power and condemnation.

IN CHRIST: Set free and Empowered by Grace to reign in life.

The enemy's strategy is to keep BELIEVERS doubting their righteousness so they never walk in the power of Truth by Grace. Right Believing silences the accuser and establishes unshakable confidence in God's love.

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: Grace teaches us to live generously, not out of obligation but from the overflow of our righteousness. Our giving—whether in time, resources, or encouragement—is a manifestation of our trust in God's provision. Challenge for Today:

- Identify an area in your life where you struggle to believe you are fully righteous IN CHRIST.
- Surrender that doubt in prayer, declaring Romans 5:17 over your life.
- Practice RADICAL GENEROSITY today by extending Grace to someone—whether through forgiveness, encouragement, or an act of kindness.

"For if by the transgression of the one, death reigned through the one, much more those who receive the abundance of Grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the One, Jesus Christ." **Romans 5:17** 

## 3 Challenge Questions:

- How does knowing I am righteous NOW and FOREVER change how I approach my relationship with God?
- In what ways have I allowed wrong believing to keep me from fully receiving God's Grace?
- What steps can I take today to walk in the boldness and confidence of my righteousness IN CHRIST?

This guide is designed to cement THE TRUTH of "Right Believing" into the hearts of BELIEVERS. When we embrace THE TRUTH that we are already made righteous, we step into a life of unshakable confidence, RADICAL GENEROSITY, and Kingdom reign.

# Day 18: RECEIVE GRACE – Pages 86 to 90

<u>Brief.</u> Today we explore the power of receiving Grace, emphasizing that when we receive Grace, we receive the Holy Spirit, the fullness of the Godhead, and THE TRUTH of God revealed IN CHRIST. Grace is not just a concept; it is the very supply of God Himself in our lives. When we stop striving and start receiving, we walk in the fullness of God's love, wisdom, and supply. This day's study breaks the contrast between the Law and Grace—how the Law demands but offers no help, while Grace always supplies. The Law is like an "F-" grade on a test—it shows us where we fall short but offers no assistance in correcting it. Grace, on the other hand, perfectly supplies everything we need, empowering us to reign in life. Key Scriptures:

"And to know the love of Christ which surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled up to all the fullness of God." **Ephesians 3:19** 

"Did you RECEIVE the Spirit by the works of the Law, or by hearing with faith?" Galatians 3:2

"Those who RECEIVE the abundance of Grace and the gift of righteousness will REIGN in life through the One, Jesus Christ... so that, as sin reigned in death, even so Grace would reign through righteousness to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." Romans 5:17,21

"For the law of the Spirit of life IN CHRIST Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death." **Romans 8:2** 

Receiving Grace is receiving God's presence and power in every aspect of life.

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Guide the group into a deep conversation about the difference between trying to earn God's favor through effort versus simply receiving His Grace. Encourage participants to reflect on how Grace provides all that the Law demands but never helps to fulfill. Discussion Prompts:

- What does it mean to RECEIVE rather than achieve God's favor?
- Why does the Law fail to help us, while Grace empowers us?
- How does understanding Grace as supply change the way we live daily?

Encourage an open discussion where people share any struggles they face in simply receiving instead of striving. Help them see that the fullness of God is received by faith, not by works.

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: Receiving Grace = Receiving the Fullness of God. When we receive Grace, we receive the Holy Spirit, who reveals Jesus and the Father. Grace supplies before we even realize our need—it is always ahead of every problem. The Law demands, but Grace supplies—Grace is not earned, it is simply received.

"This is the only thing I want to find out from you: did you RECEIVE the Spirit by the works of the Law, or by hearing with faith?" – **Galatians 3:2** 

Law vs. Grace – The "F-" Grade Illustration. The Law is like receiving an F- on a test—it accurately shows our failure but offers no help in fixing it. Grace is God giving us an A+ before the test even begins, and then teaching us how to live in that reality. The Law reveals sin but has no power to remove it; Grace destroys sin's power and replaces it with God's righteousness.

"For the law of the Spirit of life IN CHRIST Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death." **Romans 8:2** 

Receiving the Abundance of Grace = Reigning in Life. We are not meant to struggle under the burden of trying to be good enough. Those who RECEIVE Grace reign—they are not ruled by sin, fear, or self-effort. The secret to walking in power, victory, and joy is not doing more, but receiving more of Christ.

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: Grace produces a heart of generosity. Because Grace supplies everything, we are free to give without fear of lack. Challenge for Today:

- Ask God for a fresh revelation of His Grace today.
- Release a burden you've been carrying and choose to receive God's supply in that area.
- Practice RADICAL GENEROSITY—whether through finances, time, or encouragement, give without fear and trust in God's supply.

# 3 Challenge Questions:

- How does the realization that Grace supplies everything change my approach to daily struggles?
- In what areas of my life am I still trying instead of receiving?
- What would my life look like if I fully believed that I already have everything I need IN CHRIST?

**Day 19**: Victory Over Sin – Pages 91 to 95

<u>Brief.</u> Day 19 of **THE Grace Awakening** uncovers THE TRUTH about sin's voice—how it attempts to manipulate and deceive BELIEVERS. Sin is a liar, a parasite, and an uninvited intruder that masquerades as our own thoughts. However, IN CHRIST, we are dead to sin and alive to God! Through Grace, we no longer have to listen to sin's voice—we are completely free! This study exposes the deception of sin and the strategies of the enemy, revealing how he uses lies to attack our minds in an attempt to access our hearts. But through Christ, Grace reigns in our minds and hearts, bringing victory over every lie. Key Scriptures:

"For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, being justified as a gift by His Grace through the redemption which is IN CHRIST Jesus." **Romans 3:23-24** 

"For sin, taking an opportunity through the commandment, deceived me and through it killed me." **Romans 7:11** 

"Set your mind on the things above (with Christ in Heaven), not on the things that are on earth."

Colossians 3:2

"But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not carry out the desire of the flesh." Galatians 5:16

"For who has known the mind of the Lord, that he will instruct Him? But we have the mind of Christ." **1 Corinthians 2:16** 

When we believe THE TRUTH of God's Word, we live in victory over sin, free from its influence.

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Help participants recognize that sin's voice is not their own and that they do not have to listen to it! Guide them in discussions about their thought life and how they can reject the lies of sin and replace them with THE TRUTH of God's Grace. Discussion Prompts:

- How has sin tried to masquerade as your own thoughts?
- What does it mean that we are dead to sin but alive to Christ?
- How can we train our minds to reject sin's lies and embrace God's truth?

Encourage participants to renew their minds daily by meditating on God's truth rather than listening to the deception of sin.

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: Sin is a Lie—We Listen to Grace! Sin tries to sound like us—it is a voice of criticism, judgment, selfishness, entitlement, and deception. Sin's voice is NOT our voice—it is an intruder trying to manipulate us into believing lies. IN CHRIST, we can ignore sin's voice completely because we are dead to sin!

"For sin, taking an opportunity through the commandment, deceived me and through it killed me." – **Romans 7:11** 

Sin is a Dead Echo—Grace is the Only Truth. The Law exposes sin but has no power to remove it—only Grace sets us free! Sin is a powerless, dead program—it tries to replay its lies, but IN CHRIST, we no longer have to listen! Instead of sin, we have TRUTH!

"Set your mind on the things above (with Christ in Heaven), not on the things that are on earth."

Colossians 3:2

Victory Over Sin's Lies. The devil prowls like a roaring lion, seeking to deceive us, but we are not ignorant of his schemes! We reject lies and take every thought captive to the obedience of Christ. Every lie that tries to enter our minds is a trespasser!

"Be of sober spirit, be on the alert. Your adversary, the devil, prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour." – **1 Peter 5:8** 

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: Grace is God's absolute supply, and because we are dead to sin, we are free to live generously! Challenge for Today:

- Examine your thoughts—Are there any lies you've been believing?
- Replace every lie with truth—Speak out God's Word over your life.
- Practice RADICAL GENEROSITY—Give, encourage, or support someone today as an expression of your freedom IN CHRIST!

## 3 Challenge Questions:

- In what ways has sin tried to deceive me into believing its voice is mine?
- How does the reality that I am dead to sin and alive to Christ change how I live?
- What practical steps can I take to renew my mind daily with THE TRUTH of God's Word?

# Day 20: Right Standing IN CHRIST - Pages 96 to 100

<u>Brief</u>: Day 20 explores how Right Believing leads to Right Standing IN CHRIST. We do not earn our righteousness; rather, it is a free gift given through Jesus' obedience. This study reinforces that we live from victory, not for it—our identity is secure IN CHRIST. We are justified by Grace through faith, permanently at peace with God, and empowered to walk in bold confidence. Our mission is not to strive for acceptance but to live from the acceptance already given by Grace.

"Therefore, HAVING BEEN justified BY FAITH, WE HAVE PEACE WITH GOD through our LORD JESUS CHRIST, through whom also we have obtained our introduction BY FAITH into this GRACE in which we stand; and we exult in hope of the GLORY OF GOD." Romans 5:1-2

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Encourage participants to reflect on what it means to stand in righteousness rather than trying to earn it. Many struggle with a performance-based mindset, feeling they must do more to please God. This study dismantles that belief, replacing it with the liberating truth of Grace. Discussion Prompts:

How does knowing we are righteous now change the way we live?

- What are common misconceptions about righteousness?
- How can we shift from striving for righteousness to simply receiving it?

Encourage an open discussion about the challenges people face in embracing their right standing apart from works and the freedom that comes when we fully trust in Jesus' obedience rather than our own efforts.

<u>Grace Coaching Notes</u>: Jesus' Obedience Secured Our Righteousness. Our righteousness is not progressive—it is immediate and complete. It is not based on behavior but entirely on Christ's finished work. We do not work for righteousness; we work from righteousness.

"For whatever is born of God OVERCOMES THE WORLD; and this is THE VICTORY that has overcome the world—OUR FAITH. Who is the one WHO OVERCOMES THE WORLD, but HE WHO BELIEVES that Jesus is the Son of God?" 1 John 5:4-5

YOU AS RIGHTEOUS AS JESUS! HE DID THAT ON YOUR BEHALF, JUST RECEIVE IT AS TRUTH. The righteousness we receive is not partial—it is the same righteousness Jesus has. We can boldly approach God without fear or condemnation. We are called to live confidently, knowing our identity is secure IN CHRIST.

"By this, love is perfected WITH US, so that we may have confidence in the day of judgment; because AS HE IS, so also ARE WE in this world." **1 John 4:17** 

Overcoming Doubt and Unbelief. Many BELIEVERS struggle with accepting their full righteousness because of past failures. Grace destroys condemnation—there is no guilt for those IN CHRIST. We are called to stand firm in our identity IN CHRIST, rejecting any lie that says we must "do more" to be accepted.

"For while we were still helpless, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly." Romans 5:6

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: Right Standing IN CHRIST produces a heart of generosity. When we understand we are fully supplied in Grace, we live open-handedly, freely giving to others. Challenge for Today:

- Identify an area in your life where you are still striving instead of receiving.
- Declare THE TRUTH over yourself: "I am righteous IN CHRIST. I lack nothing."
- Practice RADICAL GENEROSITY today—give freely, whether it's time, encouragement, or resources, as an expression of your trust in God's supply.

### 3 Challenge Questions:

- How does the realization that Grace supplies everything impact my relationship with God?
- What areas of my life have I been trying to "earn" what has already been given to me?
- How would my daily life change if I fully believed that I am already righteous IN CHRIST?

# Day 21: Obedience by Grace - Pages 101 to 105

<u>Brief</u>: Day 21 delves into the obedience of Christ and how, through His Grace, we are empowered to walk in obedience—not as a burden, but as a joyous response to His love. This lesson explores how Jesus' obedience, not ours, secures our righteousness and how we receive His obedience by faith. By surrendering to Christ, we are transformed from striving individuals to FOLLOWERS living in the fullness of God's will.

"After you have suffered for a little while, the God of all Grace, who called you to His eternal glory IN CHRIST, WILL HIMSELF perfect, confirm, strengthen and establish you." 1 Peter 5:10

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Encourage participants to reflect on obedience as a fruit of Grace rather than a legalistic requirement. Many BELIEVERS misunderstand obedience, seeing it as a means to gain favor with God rather than a natural outflow of His life in us. Discussion Prompts:

- What is the difference between striving for obedience and receiving Christ's obedience?
- How does surrendering to Christ transform our ability to follow Him?
- Why is obedience by Grace more powerful than self-effort?

Encourage participants to see obedience as a gift from Christ, rather than a task to be completed in their own strength.

### **Grace Coaching Notes**:

- 1. Obedience Is Christ's Work in Us
  - True obedience is impossible in our own strength.
  - We are not called to achieve obedience but to receive it.
  - The Holy Spirit manifests Christ's obedience in us.

"For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh, for the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh, but divinely powerful for the destruction of fortresses... taking every thought captive to the OBEDIENCE of Christ." 2 Corinthians 10:3-6

#### 2. The Power of Surrendered Obedience

- Obedience by Grace is a joyful response, not a heavy requirement.
- We obey because Christ's life is at work within us.
- When we surrender, we allow Jesus to live through us.

"For we are His workmanship, created IN CHRIST Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them." **Ephesians 2:10** 

# 3. Walking in Obedience by the Spirit

- The Holy Spirit leads us into obedience naturally.
- Our role is to align with His leading, not force our own way.
- The fruit of obedience flows from intimacy with Christ.

"The one who practices sin is of the devil; for the devil has sinned from the beginning. The SON of GOD appeared for this purpose, TO DESTROY THE WORKS OF THE DEVIL." 1 John 3:8

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: Obedience is an act of faith, and faith manifests in generosity. When we trust in God's provision, we can give freely, knowing He supplies all we need. Challenge for Today:

- Ask God to reveal an area where you have been striving instead of receiving His obedience.
- Surrender that area in prayer, trusting the Holy Spirit to lead you.
- Express generosity today—whether through finances, time, or encouragement—as an act of faith in God's abundant supply.

### 3 Challenge Questions:

- How does knowing obedience is Christ's work in me change my approach to following God?
- What areas of my life am I still trying to control instead of surrendering?

• How can I cultivate a deeper reliance on the Holy Spirit to lead me in daily obedience?

# Day 22: Victory IN CHRIST - Pages 106 to 110

<u>Brief</u>: Day 22 focuses on the victory BELIEVERS have IN CHRIST through His finished work. We are already seated with Him in Heavenly places, fully righteous, cleansed, and prepared for His return. There is no "future cleansing" or additional step required—we are saved, kept, and victorious IN CHRIST right now.

"But to which of the angels has He ever said, 'SIT at My right hand, Until I make Your enemies A footstool for Your feet'?" **Hebrews 1:13** 

<u>For Group Facilitators</u>: Help participants understand their permanent position IN CHRIST and the absolute nature of Grace. Many struggle with doubts about their salvation or worthiness, feeling they must "do more" to be accepted. Today's lesson destroys that lie by affirming the completeness of Jesus' work. Discussion Prompts:

- How does knowing you are already victorious change your daily life?
- What are common fears or doubts that keep BELIEVERS from resting in their salvation?
- Why is it essential to shift from a striving mindset to a receiving mindset?

Encourage participants to celebrate the reality that we reign with Christ right now, rather than waiting for some future approval.

### Grace Coaching Notes:

- 1. We Are Already Clean and Prepared
  - Jesus has fully sanctified His Bride.
  - There is no future cleansing or requirement.
  - We receive righteousness—we don't earn it.

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive:</u> Victory IN CHRIST produces confidence, joy, and generosity. We give because we know we lack nothing in Him. True victory means we live freely and abundantly, knowing God supplies all our needs. Challenge for Today:

- Spend time thanking God for the completeness of your salvation.
- Identify an area where you've been striving instead of receiving.
- Find a way to give today—whether it's your time, encouragement, or resources—as an expression of your trust in God's supply.

# 3 Challenge Questions:

- How does knowing my salvation is secure impact the way I approach God?
- What are some religious mindsets I need to let go of in order to fully rest IN CHRIST's victory?
- In what ways can I reflect the victory of Christ to those around me?

Day 23: Becoming the Righteousness of God - Pages 111 to 115

<u>Brief</u>: Today, we embrace the profound reality that we have become the righteousness of God IN CHRIST. Through the finished work of Jesus, we no longer strive for righteousness but receive it as a free gift of Grace. This truth reshapes our identity, calling us to live as ambassadors of God's righteousness and love in the world.

"Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were making an appeal through us; we beg you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might BECOME THE RIGHTEOUSNESS OF GOD IN CHRIST."

#### 2 Corinthians 5:20-21

Jesus became sin on our behalf so that we become the righteousness of God. Our righteousness is not self-earned; it is the unearned, unmerited favor of God—Grace!

"For of His fullness we have all RECEIVED, and Grace upon Grace. For the Law was given through Moses; Grace and truth were realized through Jesus Christ." **John 1:16-17** 

We are called and commanded to stand in this righteousness by Grace and to reflect His love to the world.

"Stand firm therefore, having girded your loins with truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness." **Ephesians 6:14** 

### For Group Facilitators:

- Encourage participants to meditate on their righteousness IN CHRIST and reject any lies of unworthiness.
- Discuss how this new identity influences daily life and interactions.
- Lead in prayer and declaration over each person's standing in Grace.

Grace Coaching Notes: Your righteousness is a position, not an achievement.

- It is freely given through Jesus, not earned by works (Romans 3:24).
- We are permanently righteous IN CHRIST (Romans 5:19).
- We live from righteousness, not for it.
- Righteousness is the foundation of our **Spiritual Formation**.
- We walk by faith in this truth (Romans 10:10).
- Grace sustains our righteousness.

- We are kept by His Grace (Romans 8:28-38).
- By His Grace, NOTHING can separate us from HIS LOVE **IN CHRIST.**

"being justified as a gift by His Grace through the redemption which is IN CHRIST Jesus;"

Romans 3:24

"For as through the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, even so through the obedience of the One the many will be made righteous." Romans 5:19

"for with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation." **Romans 10:10** 

"And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose. For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son, so that He would be the firstborn among many brethren; and these whom He predestined. He also called; and these whom He called, He also justified; and these whom He justified, He also glorified. What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him over for us all, how will He not also with Him freely give us all things? Who will bring a charge against God's elect? God is the one who justifies; who is the one who condemns? Christ Jesus is He who died, yes, rather who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who also intercedes for us. Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? Just as it is written, "For Your sake we are being put to death all day long; We were considered as sheep to be slaughtered." But in all these things we overwhelmingly conquer through Him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing, will be able to separate us from the love of God, which is IN CHRIST Jesus our Lord." Romans 8:28-39

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: Live from the abundance of God's righteousness by freely giving to others. This includes:

- Forgiving without conditions, as you have been forgiven.
- Loving without limits, as you have been loved.
- Serving without expectation, as Christ served you.

#### 3 Challenge Questions:

- Do I truly believe that I am already the righteousness of God IN CHRIST, or am I still striving to earn it?
- How does my understanding of righteousness influence my daily decisions and relationships?
- Who can I bless today by reflecting God's RADICAL GENEROSITY and unconditional love?

# Day 24: Agents of Light - Pages 116 to 120

<u>Brief:</u> Today, we recognize our divine calling as agents of light, empowered by the Holy Spirit to bring God's order out of chaos. Through Jesus, we are given the fullness of Grace and truth, equipping us to illuminate the world with His love and righteousness.

"And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of Grace and truth... For of His fullness we have all RECEIVED, and Grace upon Grace. For the Law was given through Moses; Grace and truth were realized through Jesus Christ." John 1:14,16-17

By Grace, we are empowered to choose light over darkness and live as reflections of Jesus.

"If therefore your whole body is full of light, with no dark part in it, it will be wholly illumined, as when the lamp illumines you with its rays." **Luke 11:36** 

We are fully equipped to co-create, co-rule, and co-reign with God as ambassadors of His righteousness.

"Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were making an appeal through us; we beg you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God." **2 Corinthians 5:19-20** 

# For Group Facilitators:

- Encourage participants to embrace their identity as agents of light.
- Discuss the impact of choosing God's order over the world's chaos.
- Lead in prayer and declaration for boldness and faithfulness in being the light of the world.

### Grace Coaching Notes:

- God's Grace empowers us to destroy darkness.
- The Holy Spirit dwells within us, making us a beacon of God's truth (2 Corinthians 5:17).
- We expose darkness by living in His light (Luke 12:3).
- Rebellion leads to chaos; surrender leads to peace.
- Disobedience distances us from God's order (2 Corinthians 5:15).
- Following Christ brings life, love, and transformation.

- Meeting the needs of those struggling in darkness and despair.
- Walking in mercy and forgiveness, reflecting God's unconditional love.

#### 3 Challenge Questions:

- In what ways am I currently shining the light of Christ in my daily life?
- Are there areas where I am still allowing darkness or chaos to reign?
- Who in my life needs encouragement and truth today, and how can I be an agent of light to them?

# Day 25: Spiritual Formation - Pages 121 to 125

<u>Brief</u>: Spiritual Formation is Kingdom Living in action! It is a supernatural process of growth and transformation, entirely a gift of Grace from our loving Father. We do not form ourselves—God is the one who forms us into the image of His Son, not as a result of works, so that no one may boast (Ephesians 2:9). We are His workmanship, created IN CHRIST Jesus for good works, which God Himself prepared beforehand (Ephesians 2:10).

"not as a result of works, so that no one may boast." Ephesians 2:9

"For we are His workmanship, created IN CHRIST Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them." **Ephesians 2:10** 

"who has saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works, but according to His own purpose and Grace which was granted us IN CHRIST Jesus from all eternity."

2 Timothy 1:9

True **Spiritual Formation** is not personal development, self-improvement, or mere intellectual growth. It is not human wisdom, philosophy, or maturity through life experiences—it is an act of God! Jesus Himself is our teacher, our Rabbi, leading us deeper into His Kingdom.

"After you have suffered for a little while, the GOD OF ALL GRACE, who called you to His eternal glory IN CHRIST, WILL HIMSELF perfect, confirm, strengthen and establish you."

1 Peter 5:10

This transformation is not by our strength but by abiding IN CHRIST.

"I am the vine, you are the branches; he who abides in Me and I in him, he bears much fruit, APART FROM ME YOU CAN DO NOTHING." **John 15:5** 

This is **Spiritual Formation**—growth by Grace, not by human effort. It is the gift of God through Jesus Christ!

### For Group Facilitators:

- Guide participants into understanding the divine process of Spiritual Formation—emphasizing that it is God's work, not ours.
- Encourage a shift from self-effort to complete dependency on God's Grace.

Mentoring others in their spiritual walk, pouring into them what God has given us.

- Giving time and presence to those struggling in faith, standing firm as a beacon of Christ's love.
- Serving selflessly, reflecting Jesus' humility, knowing that we are His workmanship, created for good works (Ephesians 2:10).
- Encouraging and comforting others with the same comfort we have received from God (2 Corinthians 1:3-4).

"For we are His workmanship, created IN CHRIST Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them." **Ephesians 2:10** 

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our affliction so that we will be able to comfort those who are in any affliction with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God."

- Am I striving for spiritual growth through my own effort, or am I fully depending on God's Grace?

Day 26: The Power of Spiritual Formation - Pages 126 to 130

<u>Brief</u>: Spiritual Formation is not self-improvement, behavior modification, or mere knowledge accumulation. It is a supernatural transformation that occurs by Grace through the Holy Spirit, shaping us into the image of Christ. The essence of Kingdom Living is not about striving but about abiding IN CHRIST and letting His Spirit form us from within.

"But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as from the Lord, the Spirit."

2 Corinthians 3:18

Spiritual Formation is God's work in us, not something we accomplish by our own effort. We are His workmanship, and the Holy Spirit is the One who forms and shapes us for His glory.

"For we are His workmanship, created IN CHRIST Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them." **Ephesians 2:10** 

It is essential to understand that **Spiritual Formation** is not about trying harder but about trusting more deeply in the finished work of Jesus Christ. It is the natural result of living IN CHRIST.

"For I am confident of this very thing, that He who began a good work in you will perfect it until the day of Christ Jesus."

# Philippians 1:6

## For Group Facilitators:

- Encourage discussion on what true Spiritual Formation is—not self-improvement but a gift of Grace.
- Ask participants to reflect on the difference between personal growth and spiritual growth.
- Challenge the group to consider how abiding IN CHRIST leads to transformation rather than striving in their own strength.

- **Spiritual Formation** happens in the context of relationship.
- Jesus modeled this by walking in perfect unity with the Father.
- We are transformed not through isolation but by abiding IN CHRIST and engaging in community.

"Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself unless it abides in the vine, so neither can you unless you abide in Me." **John 15:4** 

<u>RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive</u>: Since Spiritual Formation is a gift, it is meant to be shared. Today, practice RADICAL GENEROSITY by:

- Pouring into someone else's **Spiritual Formation**.
- Share what God has taught you with a friend, family member, or fellow disciple.
- Encourage someone struggling with their faith.
- Offer to mentor a newer believer.
- Giving Grace as freely as you have received it.
- Be patient and loving to someone who is still growing.
- Show kindness and understanding rather than judgment.
- Sowing into Kingdom work.
- If God is leading you, consider supporting a ministry, a missionary, or a Kingdom initiative that is helping others grow spiritually.

"Freely you received, freely give." Matthew 10:8

### 3 Challenge Questions:

- Am I trying to "change myself," or am I surrendering to God's transformative power?
- What evidence of **Spiritual Formation** do I see in my life, and how is it different from personal self-improvement?
- Who can I encourage or disciple today to help them experience the transformative power of Grace?

# Day 27: Spiritual Formation - Transformed into His Image - Pages 131 to 135

<u>Brief</u>: Spiritual Formation is God's work in us, transforming us into His image and likeness. We are not self-made disciples, nor do we earn our transformation through effort. Instead, we are renewed by Grace, shaped by the Holy Spirit, and conformed to the image of Christ.

"But do not be called Rabbi; for One is your Teacher, and you are all brothers. Do not call anyone on earth your father; for One is your Father, He who is in heaven. Do not be called leaders; for One is your Leader, that is, Christ. But the greatest among you shall be your servant." **Matthew 23:8-11** 

**Spiritual Formation** is not about striving to be good or wise—it is about being transformed by Christ, just as He was transfigured before the disciples.

"Six days later, Jesus \*took with Him Peter and James and John, and \*brought them up on a high mountain by themselves. And He was TRANSFIGURED before them;" **Mark 9:2** 

Jesus reveals our destiny in Him—to be transformed into His image by His Spirit. Faith, creativity, and renewal are not achievements but gifts of Grace.

"And do not be conformed to this world, but BE TRANSFORMED by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect."

Romans 12:2

Spiritual Formation removes the old self and puts on the new self IN CHRIST.

"Lay aside the old self, which is being corrupted in accordance with the lusts of deceit, and be renewed in the spirit of your mind, and put on the new self, which in the likeness of God has been created in righteousness and holiness of THE TRUTH." **Ephesians 4:22-24** 

## For Group Facilitators:

- Encourage discussion on Spiritual Formation as a transformation, not self-improvement.
- How do we allow God's Spirit to renew us rather than striving in our own strength?
- Ask participants to share their experiences with transformation.
- When have they seen God changing them from the inside out?
- Challenge the group to surrender more fully to Christ's transformation.

- What areas of life need to be fully entrusted to God's renewing work?
- Lead the group in a prayer of surrender, thanking God for His ongoing work of transformation.

## **Grace Coaching Notes:**

- Spiritual Formation is God's work, not ours.
- We don't transform ourselves—God does.
- Justification, sanctification, and glorification are all His doing.

"For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son, so that He would be the firstborn among many brethren;" **Romans 8:29** 

- We are made righteous by Grace.
- Jesus defeated sin and gave us a new humanity.
- We walk by faith in the completed work of Christ.

"He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." **2 Corinthians 5:21** 

- Transformation is an ongoing process.
- God prunes and refines us like branches in a vine.
- The Fruit of the Spirit is evidence of His work in us.

"Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit, He takes away; and every branch that bears fruit, He prunes it so that it may bear more fruit." **John 15:2** 

### **RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive**:

- Since Grace transforms us, we are called to extend that same Grace to others.
- Be patient with others' transformation.
- Just as God is working on you, He is working on them.
- Invest in someone's spiritual growth.

- Mentor, disciple, or encourage a fellow believer.
- Serve with self-giving love.
- Be a reflection of Christ's love to someone in need.

"So, as those who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved, put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience;" **Colossians 3:12** 

### 3 Challenge Questions:

- Am I allowing God to transform me, or am I trying to change myself?
- What evidence of **Spiritual Formation** do I see in my life?
- How can I be an instrument of God's Grace in someone else's transformation today?

# Day 28: Spiritual Formation – Living as Friends of God - Pages 136 to 140

<u>Brief</u>: **Spiritual Formation** is our journey from being enemies of God to being made His friends by Grace. It is the process of being conformed to the image of Christ, shaped by His love, and transformed through His Grace by His Love. We were once slaves, but now we are friends of God, fully reconciled to Him and living in the reality of our new identity IN CHRIST.

"No longer do I call you slaves, for the slave does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all things that I have heard from My Father I have made known to you."

John 15:15

**Spiritual Formation** is not about personal improvement or self-achievement—it is about knowing, believing, and receiving THE TRUTH of our union with God. Everything we do, every act of obedience and mission, is for His great name's sake.

"And you have perseverance and have endured for My name's sake, and have not grown weary." **Revelation 2:3** 

**Spiritual Formation** brings us into alignment with Truth. Jesus, who is Truth, never leaves us. We are eternally ONE with the Father, completely reconciled through the blood of Jesus.

"Yet for us there is but one God, the Father, from whom are all things and we exist for Him; and one Lord, Jesus Christ, by whom are all things, and we exist through Him." 1 Corinthians 8:6

We no longer go in and out of God's presence—we now live from the Father's heart, permanently in Him. It is finished.

"One Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all who is over all and through all and in all." **Ephesians 4:5-6** 

# For Group Facilitators:

- Help participants embrace their identity as God's friends.
- What does it mean to be a friend of God instead of a slave to sin?
- Discuss the transformation from enemies to sons and daughters.
- How does understanding our reconciliation with God change the way we live?
- Encourage participants to live from a place of trust in God's finished work.
- What does it mean to rest IN CHRIST rather than strive for righteousness?
- Lead the group in a celebration of their friendship with God.
- Encourage thanksgiving, worship, and joyful acknowledgment of their new identity.

### Grace Coaching Notes:

- **Spiritual Formation** is becoming ONE with God.
- We were once enemies, but now we are friends, children, and heirs.
- We exist for Him, live through Him, and are transformed by Him.

"For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life." **Romans 5:10** 

- We now have peace with God.
- We are holy, blameless, and beyond reproach IN CHRIST.
- This peace is permanent—it cannot be lost, only rejected.

"And although you were formerly alienated and hostile in mind, engaged in evil deeds, yet He has now reconciled you in His fleshly body through death, in order to present you before Him holy and blameless and beyond reproach." **Colossians 1:21-22** 

- Spiritual Formation is knowing that God NEVER leaves us.
- He is always with us, always in us, and always transforming us.
- We don't "feel" His presence more or less—He is always fully present.

"For all who are being led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God. For you have not RECEIVED a spirit of slavery leading to fear again, but you have RECEIVED a spirit of adoption as sons by which we cry out, 'Abba! Father!'" Romans 8:14-15

## **RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive**:

Since we have received the fullness of Christ, we are called to be His light in the world. Radical generosity flows from knowing that we have everything we need in Him.

- Give without expecting in return.
- God's generosity is limitless, and so is ours.

### 3 Challenge Questions:

- Do I fully embrace my identity as a friend of God, or do I still see myself as a slave?

# Day 29: The WITH-GOD LIFE - Living in Unbroken Fellowship - Pages 141 to 145

<u>Brief</u>: Today, we step into the profound mystery of THE WITH-GOD LIFE—a life lived in constant communion with our Heavenly Father. This is our calling: to walk daily in the unshakable truth that we are never alone, never forsaken, and always living IN CHRIST. This journey is one of absolute dependence on His Grace, His Presence, and His Love, bringing us into unbroken fellowship with God.

**Spiritual Formation** is a lifelong transformation that baptizes us into the reality of our new nature IN CHRIST. It is God's work in us, shaping us to reflect His glory and to live each moment aware of His presence.

To live the WITH-GOD LIFE is to live fearlessly, knowing we are always safe IN CHRIST. It is a life of identity, purpose, and divine partnership with our Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

"He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High will abide in the shadow of the Almighty. I will say to the Lord, "My refuge and my fortress, My God, in whom I trust!" **Psalm 91:1-2** 

# For Group Facilitators:

- Lead the group in discussing the meaning of the WITH-GOD LIFE.
- What does it mean to live with an awareness of God's constant presence?
- Encourage participants to share their experiences of God's nearness.
- How have they sensed His presence in their daily lives?
- Guide the group into practical ways to cultivate unbroken fellowship with God.

# Day 30: The WITH-GOD LIFE – Unbroken Fellowship with God - Pages 146 to 150

<u>Brief</u>: Today, we celebrate the unbreakable fellowship we have with God through Jesus Christ. This is eternal life—not just a future promise, but a present reality! We are called to live WITH GOD, enjoying His presence without separation, empowered by His love and sustained by His faithfulness.

"For nothing will be impossible WITH GOD." And Mary said, "Behold, the bond slave of the Lord;
MAY IT BE DONE to me according to YOUR WORD." And the angel departed from her."

Luke 1:37-38

As FOLLOWERS of Jesus, we do not walk alone—we have been rescued from darkness, transferred into the Kingdom of God's Son, and made one with Christ. The WITH-GOD LIFE is one of total trust, surrender, and joy, where we learn to live FROM His presence, abiding in His love.

"For He rescued us from the domain of darkness, and transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins." **Colossians 1:13-14**

"This is THE PROMISE WHICH HE HIMSELF MADE to us: ETERNAL LIFE." 1 John 2:25

Our relationship with God is never severed because He is faithful. This is not based on our good or bad behavior, but on His ABSOLUTE GOODNESS. We only need to believe and receive it.

#### 3 Challenge Questions:

- Do I believe that eternal life is something I possess NOW, or do I still think of it as a future event?

# Day 32: Living in the Fullness of God's Unbroken Fellowship - Pages 156 to 160

- Many BELIEVERS do not know about their unbreakable fellowship with God—let's share this good news with three people today.

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort." **2 Corinthians 1:3** 

#### 3 Challenge Questions:

- Do I fully believe that my fellowship with God is unbroken? If not, what lies am I believing?
- How does knowing I am eternally a beloved child of God change the way I approach my daily life?
- Who in my life needs to hear about the unshakable love and unbroken presence of God? How specifically can I share this truth with them today?

Day 33: Entering Heaven's Prayer Through Humility - Pages 161 to 165

<u>Brief:</u> Today, we step into the sacred journey of humility, confession, and intercession—the pathway to a life fully surrendered to God's will and presence. Humility is not weakness, but the divine doorway into the power and authority of the Kingdom of God. Through confession, we are

purified, and through intercession, we join the Trinity in their unceasing prayer for the Church and the world.

"He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together. He is also head of the body, the church; and He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that He Himself will come to have first place in everything. For it was the Father's good pleasure for all the fullness to dwell in Him, and through Him to reconcile all things to Himself." **Colossians 1:17-20** 

The mystery of Christ in us, the hope of glory, is being revealed daily as we yield ourselves to His transforming power.

"To whom God willed to make known what is the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory." **Colossians 1:26-27** 

As we embrace humility, we are drawn deeper into the heart of God, where His Spirit intercedes through us with groanings too deep for words.

- Invite the group to humble themselves before the Lord and confess anything that is weighing on their hearts.

- Ask God to move in their life in a way they don't expect.
- Encourage someone who is struggling.
- Speak words of life and truth over them.
- Confess any pride and ask God for more of Christ's humility.
- Empty yourself so you can be filled with more of Him.

"Clothe yourselves with humility toward one another, because God is opposed to the proud, but He gives Grace to the humble."

1 Peter 5:5

#### 3 Challenge Questions:

- What areas of my life am I still holding onto pride and self-reliance?
- How can I actively practice humility before God and others?
- Who is God calling me to intercede for today?

Father, I humble myself before You, confessing my pride, my self-reliance, and my need for You. Teach me to walk in true humility, to confess my sins freely, and to stand in the gap for others. Day 34: The Power of Humility in Unceasing Prayer - Pages 166 to 170

unbroken fellowship with the Trinity. Without His humility, we cannot even begin to deny ourselves, take up our cross, and follow Him. But what He commands, He also supplies—by GRACE.

- Give anonymously.
- Bless someone without seeking recognition.
- Confess your pride and surrender completely.
- Ask God to empty you of self and fill you with more of Him.

"Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility consider one another as more important than yourselves." **Philippians 2:3** 

## 3 Challenge Questions:

- Where am I still resisting God's call to humility?
- How can I practically walk IN CHRIST's humility today?
- What would change in my life if I fully embraced a lifestyle of unceasing prayer and surrender?

Father, I surrender everything to You. Empty me of my pride, my ego, and my selfish desires. Fill me with Your humility, surrender, obedience, and love so that I may truly follow Christ. Day 35: The Throne of Grace and the Call to Unceasing Prayer - Pages 171 to 175

<u>Brief</u>: Today, we step into the reality of God's eternal plan—JESUS CHRIST, who is seated at the right hand of the Father, reigning by Grace and interceding for us at this very moment. We are called to join Him, to participate in His prayer, and to receive wave after wave of His abundant Grace.

God's eternal plan has never changed. From the beginning, His will has been to bring His children into His presence and form Christ within us. Right now, in the Throne Room of Grace, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are working IN YOU—perfecting, refining, and strengthening you until Christ is fully formed in you!

## For Group Facilitators:

## 3 Challenge Questions:

Day 36: The Power of Prayer, Grace, and Forgiveness - Pages 176 to 180

<u>Brief</u>: Today, we embrace the reality of unceasing prayer—the constant conversation between the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This eternal dialogue is an invitation for us to join in prayer, aligning our hearts with God's perfect will and abiding in His love.

"Now may our Lord Jesus Christ Himself and God our Father, who has loved us and given us eternal comfort and GOOD hope by Grace, comfort and strengthen your hearts in every good work and word." 2 Thessalonians 2:16-17

Jesus is leading all prayer, and His very life intercedes for us continually. His Word is prayer, and as His Word dwells within us, we are called to believe and live from His prayers. The Holy Spirit is always moving, transforming us from the inside out as we yield to the waves of His Grace washing over us.

"For we do not have a high priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but One who has been tempted in all things just as we are, yet without sin. Therefore let's approach the throne of Grace with confidence, so that we may RECEIVE mercy and find Grace for help at the time of our need." **Hebrews 4:15-16** 

# For Group Facilitators:

- Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal the depths of intercession and transformation through today's study.
- Encourage confession and humility:
- Ask: How can we align our hearts with Jesus' intercession for us?
- Challenge everyone to pray for someone who has hurt them.

### **Grace Coaching Notes**:

- Prayer is joining the Trinity's eternal conversation.
- The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are always communicating.
- We are invited into their perfect unity—their unceasing fellowship of love.

Today, extend radical forgiveness by:

Praying for someone who has wronged you.

- Asking God to give you love for them.
- Committing to seeing them as Christ sees them.

"Above all, KEEP FERVENT IN YOUR LOVE FOR ONE ANOTHER, because love covers a multitude of sins." 1 Peter 4:8

#### 3 Challenge Questions:

- Do I truly believe that Jesus is always interceding for me?
- Have I fully surrendered my weaknesses to Jesus in prayer?
- Is there someone I need to forgive today, even before they sin against me?

Father, thank You for the invitation to join Your unceasing prayer. Thank You for Jesus, who intercedes for me, and the Holy Spirit, who transforms me. I confess all of my weaknesses, there are many, and I RECEIVE Your Grace by Faith. Teach me to forgive as You have forgiven me. Let my life be a vessel of Your love, flowing in the power of Your unbroken fellowship. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Day 37: The Power of Prayer, Humility, and Unwavering Grace - Pages 181 to 185

<u>Brief</u>: Heaven's prayers and intercessions never cease—they are as eternal as God's love. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are in unceasing communion, and we are invited into this divine dialogue through prayer, humility, and surrender.

Trusting God should be simple—He has given us life, a Savior, and unlimited access to His presence. But our flesh resists. Pride and self-reliance fight against humility. That's why we must die to self daily, surrendering everything so that His love can flow through us freely.

"And may the Lord cause you to increase and overflow in love for one another, and for all people, just as we also do for you." 1 Thessalonians 3:12

Forgiveness and Grace are the marks of one who truly follows Christ. Jesus, the interceding High Priest, is ALIVE and seated at the Throne of Grace, praying for us right now. When we join His intercession, we begin to love as He loves—even our enemies.

"Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children; and walk in love, just as Christ also loved you and gave Himself up for us, an offering and a sacrifice to God as a fragrant aroma."

Ephesians 5:1-2

#### For Group Facilitators:

• Invite the Holy Spirit to open hearts and reveal the power of unceasing prayer.

- Encourage deep discussions.
- Ask: What does it mean to truly trust God and surrender everything?
- Challenge everyone to reflect on their prayer life and their willingness to walk in humility.

## **Grace Coaching Notes:**

- Prayer is an act of surrender and trust.
- True prayer is not just asking for things—it is joining Heaven's intercession.

- RADICAL GENEROSITY through Humility and Confession.
- Humility is the key to unlocking God's Grace in our lives.
- We receive Grace upon Grace when we live in a posture of confession and dependence on Christ.

"For the WORD OF GOD is living and active, and sharper than any two-edged sword...

Therefore let's approach the THRONE OF GRACE with CONFIDENCE, so that we may RECEIVE MERCY and FIND GRACE for help at the time of our need." **Hebrews 4:12, 16** 

## **RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive**:

- Commit to humility—start every prayer with confession.
- Forgive someone before they wrong you.
- Serve someone today who has nothing to give in return.

"Therefore HUMBLE YOURSELVES under the mighty hand of God, so that He may exalt you at the proper time." **1 Peter 5:6** 

## 3 Challenge Questions:

- Am I fully surrendered to God's will, or am I still holding onto control?
- Do I pray for my enemies and genuinely desire their redemption?
- Am I quick to confess my weaknesses and trust in God's Grace?

Father, thank You for inviting me into Your unceasing intercession. I surrender my pride, my self-reliance, and all unbelief—remove it all in Jesus' name! Fill me with Your love and compassion, so that I may forgive and serve as You have called me to. Teach me to walk in humility and to trust You completely. May my life reflect Your Grace, bringing glory to You and the Father and your Kingdom alone. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Day 38: Destroy Unbelief - Receiving Grace by Confession - Pages 186 to 190

"Immediately the boy's father cried out and said, 'I do believe; HELP MY UNBELIEF!"

Mark 9:24

<u>Brief</u>: Humility aligns us with THE TRUTH. The more we confess, the more we are transformed into the image of Christ. True humility is the ability to confess all truth with the King of Truth—especially about the wickedness of our hearts and the weaknesses of our flesh.

Confession is not a burden but a river of life that allows Grace to flow freely. When we admit our weakness and acknowledge our desperate need for Christ, He replaces our doubt with His faith, our fear with His love, and our weakness with His strength.

"If we say that we have no sin, we are deceiving ourselves and THE TRUTH is not in us. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous, so that He will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness." **1 John 1:8-9** 

Unbelief is the greatest enemy of faith. It blinds, deceives, and prevents us from fully receiving the promises of God. If we are struggling to trust God, we must ask Him to remove every trace of unbelief from our hearts!

"Yet, with respect to the promise of God, HE DID NOT WAVER IN UNBELIEF but grew strong in faith, giving glory to God, and being fully assured that what God had promised, He was able also to perform." **Romans 4:19-20** 

## For Group Facilitators:

- Invite the Holy Spirit to search hearts and expose areas of unbelief.
- Encourage confession and discussion:

- Ask: What areas of my life am I struggling to trust God completely?
- Challenge participants to write down one area where they need to surrender unbelief and trust in God's Grace.

## **Grace Coaching Notes:**

- Unbelief prevents the fullness of God's promises.
- Jesus was amazed at the unbelief of His hometown (Mark 6:5-6).
- The Israelites could not enter the Promised Land because of their unbelief (Hebrews 3:19).

#### 2 Corinthians 4:4

- Confession opens the floodgates of Grace.
- The more we confess, the more Grace flows into our lives.
- Confession removes doubt, fear, and resistance to God's will.

"Therefore, confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another so that you may be healed. A prayer of a righteous person, when it is brought about, can accomplish much."

#### **James 5:16**

- God's power is made perfect in our weakness.
- Stop trying to fix yourself—let God do it!
- Every time you acknowledge your weakness, you invite Christ's strength into your life.

"And He has said to me, 'My Grace is sufficient for you, for power is perfected in weakness.'
Most gladly, therefore, I will rather boast about my weaknesses, so that THE POWER OF
CHRIST MAY DWELL IN ME." 2 Corinthians 12:9

- Jesus already secured your victory.
- We don't have to fight for victory—we fight from victory.
- Our battle is not against sin—it is against unbelief IN CHRIST's finished work.

"Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." **Matthew 11:29** 

#### **RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive:**

Confess your unbelief to God today. Speak words of life over your faith—renounce doubt, fear, and self-reliance. Ask God for a revelation of His absolute faithfulness.

"I can do all things through Him who strengthens me." Philippians 4:13

## 3 Challenge Questions:

- What areas of my life am I still relying on my own strength instead of God's Grace?
- Am I daily confessing my need for Christ, or am I trying to manage my own sin?
- Have I asked Jesus to remove all unbelief and replace it with His faith?

Father, I surrender every ounce of unbelief in my heart to you. I confess that apart from You, I can do nothing. Expose every hidden place where I have doubted Your love, Your promises, and Your faithfulness. Replace my doubt with unwavering faith. Let Grace flood my heart, cleansing me from all unrighteousness. Jesus, I receive Your humility, surrender, belief, faith, and obedience in exchange for my all my weaknesses, doubt, and unbelief. Day 39: Living in Grace—The Power of Surrender and Obedience - Pages 191 to 195

"For God has shut up all in disOBEDIENCE, so that He may show mercy to all." Romans 11:32

<u>Brief:</u> Without Grace, we cannot obey Christ. Without Grace, we rely on our human wisdom, strength, and self-righteousness, which only leads to failure, exhaustion, and frustration. True obedience does not come from self-effort—it comes from receiving and abiding in God's Grace.

#### Without Grace:

- We lean on our own understanding, which leads to failure.
- We try to obey in our own strength, which leads to frustration.
- We struggle against sin, instead of living in victory over it.

#### With Grace:

- We are empowered to obey Christ effortlessly.
- We take every thought captive to His truth.
- We live in the fullness of our inheritance as children of God.

"For the mind set on the flesh is death, but the mind set on the Spirit is life and peace." Romans

## For Group Facilitators:

- Invite the Holy Spirit to reveal areas of self-reliance and disobedience.
- Encourage confession and discussion:
- Ask: Are there areas where I am still trying to live by my own strength instead of Grace?
- Challenge participants to write down one area where they need to surrender fully to God's Grace.

### **Grace Coaching Notes**:

- Without Grace, we are trapped in cycles of sin.
- The Apostle Paul confessed his struggle with sin, showing that self-effort leads to failure.

"Wretched man that I am! Who will set me free from the body of this death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!" Romans 7:24-25

- Grace empowers us to walk by the Spirit, not the flesh.

 Confess areas of self-reliance and surrender them to God's Grace and then go help 12 others do the same.

- Ask Jesus to reign completely on the throne of your heart, and volunteering to give up and sacrifice something very valuable to you.
- Declare that His Grace is more than enough to empower you for victory and unceremoniously give your sacrificial gift away forever.

"I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me."

Galatians 2:20

## 3 Challenge Questions:

- What areas of my life am I still holding onto instead of surrendering to God's Grace?
- Am I relying on my strength to obey Christ, or am I allowing His Grace to empower me?
- Have I fully embraced my identity as a child of God, free from condemnation?

Father, I surrender every part of my life to You. I confess that without Your Grace, I am powerless to obey. Remove every trace of self-reliance, doubt, and unbelief in my heart. Jesus, I invite You to reign completely on the throne of my heart. Let Your Grace empower me to walk in full obedience and freedom. Fill me with the abundance of Your life and your favor to share this truth, your gospel, with the world around me. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Day 40: The Hope of Glory—Christ in Us - Pages 196 to 200

"I in them and You in Me, that they may be perfected in unity, so that the world may know that You sent Me, and You loved them, just as You loved Me." **John 17:23** 

<u>Brief</u>: The greatest mystery of the Gospel is now revealed—Christ IN US, the hope of glory! This is the culmination of God's eternal plan—to dwell in His people, transforming us into His image, and uniting us in perfect love with the Father and the Son.

Through the blood of Jesus, we have been rescued from the domain of darkness and transferred into His Kingdom of LIGHT and LOVE. We are no longer alienated from God, but reconciled, redeemed, and restored. His plan is not only to save us but to conform us into His likeness, so that we may live in perfect unity with Him and each other.

"For He rescued us from the domain of darkness, and transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins." **Colossians 1:13-14** 

This is the invitation of the Gospel—not just to be forgiven but to be filled with all the fullness of God.

# For Group Facilitators:

- Ask the Holy Spirit to open hearts to the reality of Christ, the love of God dwelling in us for all eternity.
- Discuss the mystery of "CHRIST IN YOU, the hope of glory."
- What does it mean to live WITH CHRIST dwelling within us?
- Challenge participants to reflect on their spiritual transformation.
- Are you experiencing the fullness of Christ, or are you still living as if you are separated from Him?

## **Grace Coaching Notes:**

- Jesus' ultimate prayer was for us to be ONE with Him. BE ONE WITH HIM, IN HIM, and HE IN YOU by Grace working through LOVE.
- His desire is always to bring us into His glory, love, and unity with the Father.
- The purpose of salvation is not just forgiveness—it is union with God forever, in His Glory, displaying His absolute goodness.

"The glory which You have given Me I also have given to them, so that they may be one, just as We are one; I in them and You in Me, that they may be perfected in unity." **John 17:22-23** 

- We are no longer bound by sin—Christ has made us HOLY!
- Through His blood, Jesus has reconciled us completely.
- Our identity is not sinners trying to do better but His blood bought saints living in union WITH God IN Christ.

"Yet He has now reconciled you in His body of flesh through death, in order to present you before Him holy and blameless and beyond reproach." **Colossians 1:22** 

- Transformation happens through the renewing of our minds.
- We are called to live in alignment with our new identity IN CHRIST.
- This means rejecting the world's mindset and walking in God's truth.

"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind." **Romans**12:2

- Spiritual Disciplines prepare us to reign with Christ.
- We must be trained for reigning by learning to walk in obedience, prayer, and surrender.
- Christ is forming His character in us through daily discipline and dependence on Grace.

"We are destroying arguments and all arrogance raised against the knowledge of God, and we are taking every thought captive to the obedience of Christ." **2 Corinthians 10:5** 

#### **RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive**:

- Live today with full confidence that Christ is IN YOU! Consider giving away ninety percent of your income, living on 10 percent.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal areas where you are not fully embracing your identity IN CHRIST, and to be willing to teach 12 others to do the same.
- Declare that you have been made holy and blameless by His Grace and share this good news with the world by some outrageous act of generosity that no one will ever know you did it.

"Christ in you, the hope of glory." Colossians 1:27

# 3 Challenge Questions:

- Am I living as if I am still distant from God, or have I fully embraced Christ IN ME?
- How can I daily renew my mind to walk in the fullness of my identity IN CHRIST?
- What Spiritual Disciplines can I implement to grow in unity with God and His Church?

Father, I receive THE TRUTH that Christ dwells in me. I surrender every part of my life to You and ask for Your Spirit to fully renew my mind by Grace working through your love. Teach me to walk in the fullness of my identity as Your child, no longer bound by sin, but set free to live in union with You by Grace. Transform me, Lord, and make me a vessel of Your love and power in this world by Grace working through your love as it pours in and out of me to glorify your GOOD NAME, I pray in Jesus' name, Amen.

Day 41: Training for Reigning—Spiritual Disciplines by Grace - Pages 201 - 205

"Discipline yourself for the purpose of godliness." 1 Timothy 4:7

<u>Brief:</u> Spiritual Disciplines, when practiced without God's Grace, are powerless religious rituals, leading only to self-righteousness, pride, and burnout. However, when infused with the power of Grace, they become transformative tools that bring us into deeper intimacy with Christ and equip us for our Kingdom calling.

God never intended for us to approach prayer, fasting, or Bible study as means to earn His favor—we already have His favor through Christ! Instead, these disciplines are avenues to receive, abide, and grow in His Grace.

"For what the Law could not do, weak as it was through the flesh, GOD DID: sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and as an offering for sin, HE CONDEMNED SIN IN THE FLESH." Romans 8:3

Spiritual Disciplines do not transform us—Grace does! They simply position our hearts to be transformed by the power of Christ working within us.

# For Group Facilitators:

- Start with a prayer asking for God's humility, surrender, obedience, and love.
- Ask for God's Grace to empower all Spiritual Disciplines in your life.
- Discuss how disciplines can become legalistic without Grace.
- What happens when we approach Bible study, fasting, or prayer with a self-righteous mindset?
- Encourage personal reflection:
- Have you ever practiced Spiritual Disciplines without relying on God's Grace? What was the result?

## **Grace Coaching Notes**:

- Spiritual Disciplines apart from Grace are DEAD WORKS.
- The Pharisees were masters of Spiritual Disciplines, yet they missed Christ entirely.
- They memorized Scripture, fasted, and prayed—but they lacked true transformation.

"You blind Pharisee, first clean the inside of the cup and of the dish, so that the outside of it may also become clean." **Matthew 23:26** 

- Jesus practiced Spiritual Disciplines THROUGH GRACE.
- Every time Jesus prayed, fasted, or meditated on Scripture, He was led by the Spirit, not the flesh.
- He gave us His Grace to practice them in the same way.

"And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us; and we saw His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, FULL OF GRACE AND TRUTH." **John 1:14** 

- Spiritual Disciplines do not earn us blessings—they make us available for Kingdom service.
- We don't practice disciplines to get something from God—we practice them to become available for HIS GLORY.
- When we fast, pray, and study through Grace, we are training to reign with Christ.

"Suffer hardship with me, as a GOOD SOLDIER of Christ Jesus." 2 Timothy 2:3

#### RADICAL GENEROSITY Directive:

- Ask Jesus to give you His Grace for practicing Spiritual Disciplines.
- Commit to practicing one discipline this week—not to get closer to God, but to receive more of His Grace in your life.
- Encourage someone in their spiritual journey by sharing how Grace has transformed your disciplines.

"For all things are for your sakes, so that by Grace, having spread to more and more people, will cause thanksgiving to overflow TO THE GLORY OF GOD." **2 Corinthians 4:15** 

# 3 Challenge Questions:

- Have I been practicing Spiritual Disciplines out of duty rather than delight?
- Am I allowing God's Grace to do the transforming work, or am I relying on my own efforts?
- How can I shift my focus from "doing for God" to "receiving from God" in my daily disciplines?

Heavenly Father, I confess that I have sometimes approached Spiritual Disciplines as a task rather than a gift of Grace. Teach me to rest in Your power, knowing that only Your Grace can transform me. Fill me with a hunger for Your Word, a love for prayer, and a heart that fasts not for my gain but for Your glory. Let my life be a reflection of Christ, trained and equipped for Your Kingdom. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Day 42: Training for Reigning: Living by Grace-Spiritual Disciplines - Pages 206 to 210

"Whatever you do, do your work heartily, as for the Lord and not for people." Colossians 3:23

<u>Brief</u>: Spiritual Disciplines are not about religious effort—they are about abiding IN CHRIST and receiving His Grace. By meditating on His Word, resting in His presence, practicing silence, giving generously, celebrating His goodness, and serving others, we align our lives with His Kingdom reality. Through these daily practices of Grace, we are being transformed into the image of Christ and becoming vessels of His power and love in the world.

#### For Group Facilitators:

- Discuss how Spiritual Disciplines differ when practiced through Grace versus human effort
- Have participants reflect on which disciplines they need to engage in more by Grace working through love.
- Encourage each member to commit to one discipline this week with a focus on receiving God's Grace through it.

#### **Grace Coaching Notes**:

1. Meditation on God's Word DAILY—Aligning with Truth DAILY.

"Set your minds on the things that are above, not on the things that are on earth."

#### Colossians 3:2

Meditating on Scripture renews our minds and aligns us with God's eternal truth. The more we soak in His Word, the more our thoughts, desires, and actions become Christlike.

*Grace Activation*: Take 5 minutes today to meditate on one Scripture, asking the Holy Spirit to reveal its deeper meaning and application in your life.

2. Rest—The Power of Sabbath in Grace

"Therefore let's make every effort to enter that rest, so that no one will fall by following the same example of disobedience." **Hebrews 4:11** 

Resting in God is not about stopping work—it's about trusting fully in His Grace. Sabbath is an intentional pause to reflect, rejuvenate, and experience the refreshing love of Christ.

*Grace Activation*: Schedule one FULL 24-hour period this week for Sabbath rest—free of distractions, worries, or work—just resting in God's presence.

3. Silence—Hearing God in the Stillness

"Be still, and know that I am God." Psalm 46:10

The noise of life often drowns out God's whispers. Silence is a sacred discipline that creates space for the Holy Spirit's guidance.

*Grace Activation*: Spend five minutes in silence today, simply resting in God's presence and listening for His voice.

4. Generosity—Freely Giving as We Have Received

"Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over, will be poured into your lap." **Luke 6:38** 

Generosity is not just about money—it's about giving love, time, and kindness. When we freely give, we mirror God's abundant Grace.

*Grace Activation*: Look for one opportunity today to be radically generous—through words, time, encouragement, or resources.

5. Celebration—Rejoicing in God's Goodness

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice!" Philippians 4:4

Celebration is an act of worship—thanking God not just for what He has done but for who He is. Even in trials, we can celebrate His faithfulness.

*Grace Activation*: Celebrate one thing God has done in your life today—give Him thanks and share it with someone.

6. Service—Becoming the Hands and Feet of Christ

"For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many." **Mark 10:45** 

Serving is not a duty—it's a privilege. When we serve others, we display the love of Jesus and live in and from His Kingdom of love.

*Grace Activation*: Find one way to serve someone (love someone radically) this week—without expecting anything in return.

#### Spiritual Disciplines as Gifts of Grace

Spiritual Disciplines are not about self-improvement—they are about allowing God to shape us into Christ's image. Additional disciplines that position us to RECEIVE GOD'S GRACE:

Humility—Recognizing that apart from God's Grace, we can do nothing. (James 4:10)

**Gratitude**—Thanking God for everything, even trials. (1 Thessalonians 5:18)

**Trust**—Resting in God's perfect plan. (Proverbs 3:5-6)

Patience—Waiting on God's timing with a peaceful heart. (Psalm 37:7)

Surrender—Letting go of control and yielding to God's will. (Romans 12:1)

**Contentment**—Finding joy in God alone. (Philippians 4:11-12)

**Compassion**—Loving others as Christ loves us. (Colossians 3:12)

**Integrity**—Walking in truth and honesty. (1 Corinthians 6:19-20)

Grace Activation: Ask the Holy Spirit, "Which discipline do You want me to focus on today?"

"in everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you IN CHRIST Jesus."

1 Thessalonians 5:18

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart And do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, And He will make your paths straight." **Proverbs 3:5-6** 

Rest in the Lord and wait patiently for Him; Do not fret because of him who prospers in his way,

Because of the man who carries out wicked schemes." **Psalm 37:7** 

"Therefore I urge you, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship." **Romans 12:1** 

"Not that I speak from want, for I have learned to be content in whatever circumstances I am. I know how to get along with humble means, and I also know how to live in prosperity; in any and every circumstance I have learned the secret of being filled and going hungry, both of having abundance and suffering need." **Philippians 4:11-12** 

"So, as those who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved, put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience;" **Colossians 3:12** 

"Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you have been bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body." **1 Corinthians 6:19-20** 

### 3 Challenge Questions:

- Which Spiritual Discipline do I struggle with the most, and how can I invite God's Grace into it?
- Have I been practicing Spiritual Disciplines out of obligation rather than delight?
- What would my life look like if I fully embraced these disciplines through Grace?

The God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, thank You for the gift of Your Grace. Teach me to engage in Spiritual Disciplines not as tasks, but as doorways to experience more of You. May I rest in Your love, meditate on Your truth, and practice generosity, silence, and celebration with a heart full of gratitude IN CHRIST. Transform me through Your Grace King Jesus, so that my life becomes a reflection of you. In His name, Amen.

Day 43: Christ Formed in Us—Training for Reigning - Pages 211 to 215

"Blessed are the gentle, for they will inherit the earth." Matthew 5:5

<u>Brief</u>: The ultimate goal of our faith is Christ formed in us. This is not accomplished by human effort but by Grace working through love. Our part is to confess our sins and weaknesses, invite His indwelling presence, and wait in surrender.

Spiritual Disciplines are our training ground. As we engage in prayer, fasting, Bible study, generosity, and rest—not out of obligation but by Grace—we become vessels of God's power, wisdom, and love T BE POURED OUT TO THOSE WHO ARE PERISHING.

This is what it means to be *Training for Reigning*.

#### For Group Facilitators:

- What does it mean for Christ to be formed in us?
- Why do we need both surrender and discipline?
- What discipline have you neglected that the Holy Spirit is calling you to revive?

## **Grace Coaching Notes**:

1. The Unceasing Intercession of the Trinity.

# "<u>Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness</u>, for they will be satisfied." Matthew 5:6

Jesus and the Holy Spirit never cease interceding for the saints. Their work is constant, eternal, and unbroken. Our role is to align with this divine intercession by practicing Spiritual Disciplines under Grace.

<u>Grace Activation</u>: Today, join in the intercession of Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Spend 5 minutes praying for someone in need, asking the Father to align your prayers with His intercession and will.

2. Presenting Our Bodies as Living Sacrifices.

## "Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy." Matthew 5:7

By Grace working through faith, we present our entire being—mind, body, and soul—as instruments of God's Kingdom. This is our reasonable service as those raised from the dead IN CHRIST.

<u>Grace Activation</u>: Reflect on areas where you still hold back from God. Surrender them in prayer, trusting He will remove every weakness you yield.

3. Spiritual Disciplines Expose Our Selfishness

#### "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God." Matthew 5:8

As we practice the disciplines of solitude, fasting, and confession, we see the depths of our selfishness and pride. The Holy Spirit reveals our hidden motives, calling us to surrender before He removes this by Grace working through Love.

<u>Grace Activation</u>: Ask the Holy Spirit today, "What is one hidden sin or selfish desire You want to remove from my heart?" Listen and confess what He reveals.

#### 4. The Call to Be Ambassadors of Peace

## "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called sons of God." Matthew 5:9

God is preparing you to be His witness. Peacemakers are not passive—they actively bridge divides, heal wounds, and lead others into reconciliation with God. It can get messy!

<u>Grace Activation</u>: Reach out to someone today with a word of PEACE, reconciliation, or encouragement working through love—BE FILLED WITH GRACE AND GIVE IT ALL.

## 5. Persecution Is a Promise—Be Ready

# "Blessed are those who have been persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." Matthew 5:10

When you truly live by Grace, you will face persecution. But don't fear—this is your training ground. God is preparing you for greater assignments in His Kingdom.

<u>Grace Activation</u>: If you're facing opposition or rejection for your faith, rejoice! Spend time thanking God that He has counted you worthy to share IN CHRIST's sufferings.

## Who Is an Apprentice of Jesus Christ?

An Apprentice of Jesus Christ is someone who has surrendered everything to follow King Jesus, our only Rabbi, Teacher, and Leader, seeking to be transformed into His image by Grace.

## Apprenticeship involves:

- Learning from Jesus as our Rabbi and Teacher.
- Practicing Spiritual Disciplines under Grace.
- Hungering for God's continual presence.
- Desiring to love and serve others by Grace.
- Growing in holiness and righteousness by Grace.
- Facing trials with faith and perseverance.
- Living in joyful surrender to God's will by Grace.
- Advancing the Kingdom of God by Grace working through LOVE.

Being an Apprentice of Jesus isn't about religious obligation—it's about waiting upon the Holy Spirit to take you through a radical transformation, being made into Christ's likeness by Grace.

#### Your Next Step—A Deeper Journey Into Salvation, Healing, and Deliverance

As we get closer to concluding this 8-week journey, remember: this is just the beginning.

"Go, therefore, and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to follow ALL that I commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20

- This journey of Grace continues with an even deeper revelation of God's full salvation.
- How Jesus' full salvation includes healing and freedom from all oppression.
- The ministry of healing and deliverance as part of the Great Commission.
- How to walk in the fullness of Christ's power and authority.

This is the next level of our calling—to partner with Jesus in restoring the broken and setting the captives free.

#### 3 Challenge Questions:

- What does it mean for Christ to be formed in me?
- How can I move from mere belief to active apprenticeship with Jesus?
- Which Spiritual Discipline do I need to deepen in my daily life?

As I surrender, You are shaping me into a vessel of Jesus' very own Humility, Surrender, and Obedience, fit for Your Kingdom. Teach King Jesus, teach me to walk in YOUR Humility, my confession, and YOUR intercession daily. Let the Spiritual Disciplines of Grace transform my heart, so that I may be YOUR light to others. Prepare me to step into my next assignment—bringing salvation, LOVE, healing, and deliverance to a world in desperate need of Jesus. In Jesus' mighty name, we pray Amen.

Day 44: The Ruler of the Kings of the Earth – Pages 216 to 220

<u>Brief</u>: We have reached a crucial point in this journey of **The Grace Awakening**. We have been transformed, renewed, and empowered to live IN CHRIST. But what now? The time for passive Christianity is over. We are not only saved by Grace—we are called to rule and reign with Jesus.

**Revelation 5:10** "You have made them to be a kingdom and priests to our God, and they will reign upon the earth."

Jesus is not just our Savior; He is the King of kings and the Lord of lords. As disciples, we must recognize that our faith is not about "waiting to escape" but preparing to reign. #### Ask thought-provoking questions

- 1. How does knowing that Jesus is the Ruler of all change how you live?
- 2. What does it mean to be training for reigning?
- 3. What does multiplying your talents look like in your daily life?
- 4. Encourage personal testimony—what is one thing the Holy Spirit has revealed to you through **The Grace Awakening** so far?

5. Set a clear action plan—what practical steps can each disciple take this week to actively prepare for The Millennial Reign of Christ?

## **Grace Coaching Notes**:

The most dangerous mindset in the modern Church is passive spectator carnal Christianity—believing that because we are saved, we can sit back and wait for Heaven. But Jesus didn't save us to sit; He saved us to serve, disciple, and reign.

**Revelation 1:6** "and He has made us to be a kingdom, priests to His God and Father—to Him be the glory and the dominion forever and ever. Amen."

You are a king and a priest before God. That means your role now is to steward, multiply, and prepare for your eternal position in HIS coming Kingdom.

## Ask yourself:

- 1. Am I truly investing everything into the Kingdom of God?
- 2. If Jesus returned today, would I be found faithful or fearful?
- 3. Am I a wise virgin with my lamp full?
- 4. How am I discipling others?

Your next step is NOT optional—it is obedience.

#### **RADICAL GENEROSITY Directives**:

- 1. **Give sacrificially**. Find a way this week to give beyond your comfort zone—whether financially, with your time, or with your resources.

Day 45: Kingdom Foundations – Preparing to Reign - Pages 221-225

<u>Brief.</u> The time for passive Christianity is over. We are not only saved by Grace—we are called to rule and reign with Jesus.

**Revelation 5:10** "You have made them into a kingdom and priests to our God, and they will reign upon the earth."

**THE Grace Awakening** and **The School of KINGDOM Living** are not just about personal transformation—they are a divine invitation to co-labor with Christ in His eternal reign. Our faith is not about "waiting to escape" but about actively preparing to govern, steward, and build upon the Rock that will remain forever.

Matthew 7:24-27 "Therefore everyone who hears these words of Mine and acts on them, may be compared to a wise man who built his house on the rock. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and slammed against that house; and yet it did not fall, for it had been founded on the rock. Everyone who hears these words of Mine and does not act on them, will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand. The rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and slammed against that house; and it fell—and great was its fall."

Everything we do must be built on Jesus as our eternal foundation. Jesus warned us that only what is built on the Rock will stand. This means everything in our lives—our time, talents, and resources—must be invested wisely.

This is not a call to survival—it is a call to governance, multiplication, and divine stewardship. The wise will prepare. The faithful will build. The surrendered will reign. The question now is this—Will your work survive the fire?

1 Corinthians 3:12-14 "Now if anyone builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, or straw, each one's work will become evident; for the day will show it because it is to be revealed with fire, and the fire itself will test the quality of each one's work. If anyone's work which he has built on it remains, he will receive a reward."

## For Facilitator's Guide:

#### **Encouraging Deep Discipleship**

**Start with Prayer**: Ask the Holy Spirit to open every heart to understand the urgency of this call and what it means to rule and reign with Christ.

Soak on these Key Scriptures:

**Luke 17:20-21** "Now having been questioned by the Pharisees as to when the kingdom of God was coming, He answered them and said, 'The kingdom of God is not coming with signs to be observed; nor will they say, "Look, here it is!" or, "There it is!" For behold, the kingdom of God is in your midst."

Revelation 3:11-12 "I am coming quickly; hold fast to what you have, so that no one will take your crown. The one who overcomes, I will make him a pillar in the temple of My God, and he will not go out from it anymore; and I will write on him the name of My God, and the name of the city of My God, the new Jerusalem, which comes down out of heaven from My God, and My new name."

**Ephesians 2:19-22** "So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints, and are of God's household, having been built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus Himself being the cornerstone, in whom the whole building, being fitted together, is growing into a holy temple in the Lord, in whom you also are being built together into a dwelling of God in the Spirit."

## Ask Thought-Provoking Questions:

- 1. What are you actively cobuilding with the Kingdom of God?
- 2. How are you stewarding the talents God has given you?
- 3. How does knowing that Jesus is returning to reign change your mindset about your daily decisions?

#### Set Clear Action Steps:

- 1. Identify one area in your life where you need to fully surrender to Jesus.
- 2. Write down how you will multiply what God has given you this week.
- 3. Commit to mentoring and discipling at least one person to ensure they are also investing in the Kingdom.

#### Grace Coaching Notes:

The modern Church is full of believers who bury their talents in carnality, puffed up arrogance, fear, passivity, or distraction. But Jesus is coming—and His rewards are with Him.

**Revelation 22:12** "Behold, I am coming quickly, and My reward is with Me, to reward each one as his work deserves."

- The wise will prepare. The foolish will ignore the warnings.
- The faithful will multiply. The lazy will make excuses.
- The surrendered will reign. The selfish will suffer loss.

Jesus did not save us to sit—He saved us to rule and reign with Him. That means we must actively engage in discipleship, RADICAL GENEROSITY, and Kingdom cobuilding NOW. What are you building that will survive the fire?

Matthew 24:13 "But the one who endures to the end is the one who will be saved."

This is not about acquiring knowledge—this is about action.

- 1. Are you preparing for the Millennial Reign of Christ?
- 2. Are you investing what you have into the Kingdom?
- 3. Are you discipling others to do the same?

If not—why?

#### RADICAL GENEROSITY Directives:

# Day 46: Living in RADICAL GENEROSITY – Pages 226 to 230

<u>Brief</u>: We have entered a crucial phase of **The Grace Awakening**—where faith is not just believed but lived. This is the moment where we step fully into the Kingdom reality of RADICAL GENEROSITY.

James 2:17 "Even so faith, if it has no works, is dead, being by itself."

Jesus did not live with closed fists but with open hands. His love, His healing, His very life—He gave it all for us. Now, as His disciples, we are called to do the same. To give freely, to steward wisely, and to live not by the economy of this world but by the economy of Heaven.

**2 Corinthians 9:8** "And God is able to make ALL GRACE abound to you, so that always having all sufficiency in everything, **you may have an abundance for every good deed**."

RADICAL GENEROSITY is not about numbers in a bank account—it's about the posture of the heart. It's about breaking free from the grip of Mammon, releasing what is in our hands so that God can release what is in His. It's about storing up treasures in Heaven, where they will never fade or be stolen.

John 15:13 "Greater love has no one than this, that one lay down his life for his friends."

We are entering a season of supernatural giving, supernatural provision, and supernatural faith. This is not the time for small thinking. The time for fear is over. The time for hoarding is done.

We are stepping into the lifestyle of the wise and faithful servant, the ones who take what they have been given and multiply it for the glory of God.

**Luke 12:33** "Sell your possessions and give to charity; make yourselves money belts which do not wear out, an unfailing treasure in heaven, where no thief comes near nor does a moth destroy."

Will you live like Jesus? Will you live like the early Church? Will you be known in Heaven as one who poured out your life for the Kingdom?

Matthew 6:19-21 "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in or steal; for where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

### For Facilitator's Guide:

## **Encouraging Deep Discipleship**

**Start with Prayer**: Ask the Holy Spirit to break the chains of fear, greed, and self-preservation in our hearts. Pray for an increase in faith to live in RADICAL GENEROSITY.

#### Read Aloud

Matthew 6:19-21 "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in or steal; for where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

**Luke 6:38** "Give, and it will be given to you. They will pour into your lap a good measure—pressed down, shaken together, and running over. For by your standard of measure it will be measured to you in return."

Acts 20:35 "In everything I showed you that by working hard in this way you must help the weak, and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that He Himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive."

# **Ask Thought-Provoking Questions**

- 1. What is holding you back from living a life of RADICAL GENEROSITY?
- 2. How can you give beyond your comfort zone this week?
- 3. What would it look like if every Christian lived with open hands?

**Encourage Testimony**: Invite those in the group to share a time when they gave generously and saw God's provision.

**Set a Clear Action Plan:** Challenge everyone to step into a new level of generosity this week.

#### **Grace Coaching Notes**:

We live in a world that tells us to hoard, accumulate, and build bigger barns. But Jesus calls us to give, bless, and trust.

Most people will never experience the miraculous provision of God because they never step out in faith. They live under the fear of lack, clinging to what little they have, never realizing that God has more than enough waiting to be released to those who trust Him.

- Do you believe that God is your provider? Then prove it by giving fearlessly.
- Do you trust that Heaven's economy is greater than this world's economy? Then live like it.
- Do you understand that your resources are not your own? Then invest them in eternity.

Jesus lived as the most generous man who ever walked the earth. His disciples should be known for the same. If we are to reign with Him, we must first learn to give like Him. Will you step into this life of supernatural generosity?

## **RADICAL GENEROSITY Directives:**

- 1. **Give Beyond Your Comfort Zone**: Find a way to give sacrificially this week—something that costs you.
- 2. **Meet an Urgent Need**: Look for someone in your community who is struggling and bless them abundantly.
- 3. **Sow Into the Kingdom**: Consider giving to a mission, ministry, or someone dedicated to advancing the Gospel.

#### Three Personal Challenges:

- 1. **Identify and Renounce Any Fear of Lack** *Ask God to break the spirit of Mammon over your life*.
- 2. **Give Until It Feels Like Worship** Stretch yourself to give in a way that truly challenges your faith.

3. **Commit to a Life of Overflow** – *Make a personal decision to live with open hands from this day forward.* 

#### Final Call to Action:

- The time for small thinking is over. Step into a life of faith, trust, and supernatural giving.
- The Rapture is imminent. Will your resources have been hoarded in fear, or will they have been invested in eternity?
- Join the movement of Kingdom Ambassadors! Invest in the SAVE Coin project, help establish 1 BILLION Grace Homes, and fund the next great Kingdom awakening.
- The King is coming—how will He find you stewarding what He has entrusted to you?

<u>Closing Prayer</u>: Heavenly Father, we come before You with open hands and surrendered hearts. Forgive us for ever doubting Your provision, for ever fearing lack, for ever holding onto what was never ours to keep. You are our provider. You are our supply. You are more than enough. Jesus, You gave everything for us. Teach us to give like You. Break every chain of fear, greed, and self-preservation in our lives. Let us be known as a people of RADICAL GENEROSITY—giving freely, blessing abundantly, and stewarding faithfully. Holy Spirit, lead us into divine opportunities to pour out what we have been given, to meet urgent needs, and to advance the Gospel with our resources. May we store up treasures in Heaven, where they will never fade, and may we enter into Your joy as faithful stewards of the Kingdom. We choose to live in supernatural generosity. We trust You completely. And we say YES to the life of faith. In Jesus' mighty name, Amen.

# Day 47: The Economy of Heaven – Pages 231 to 235

<u>Brief</u>: We have entered the next phase of **The Grace Awakening**—where faith is not just believed but actively lived out. This is the moment when we step fully into the Kingdom reality of RADICAL GENEROSITY.

**Titus 3:8** "This statement is trustworthy; and concerning these things I want you to speak confidently, so that those who have believed God will be careful to engage in good deeds.

These things are good and beneficial for people."

Jesus did not live with closed fists but with open hands. His love, His healing, His very life—He gave it all for us. Now, as His disciples, we are called to do the same: to give freely, to steward wisely, and to live not by the economy of this world but by the economy of Heaven.

**Matthew 10:8** "Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those with leprosy, cast out demons. Freely you received, freely give."

RADICAL GENEROSITY is not about numbers in a bank account—it's about the posture of the heart. It's about breaking free from the grip of Mammon, releasing what is in our hands so that God can release what is in His. It's about storing up treasures in Heaven, where they will never fade or be stolen.

**Philippians 2:5-7** "Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, who, as He already existed in the form of God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but emptied Himself by taking the form of a bond-servant and being born in the likeness of men."

We are entering a season of supernatural giving, supernatural provision, and supernatural faith. The time for small thinking is over. The time for fear is over. The time for hoarding is done. We are stepping into the lifestyle of the wise and faithful servant—the one who takes what has been given and multiplies it for the glory of God.

**2 Corinthians 9:6-7** "Now I say this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows generously will also reap generously. Each one must do just as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."

Will you live like Jesus? Will you live like the early Church? Will you be known in Heaven as one who poured out your life for the Kingdom?

Matthew 25:20-21 "The one who had received the five talents came up and brought five more talents, saying, 'Master, you entrusted five talents to me. See, I have gained five more talents.' His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant. You were faithful with a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter the joy of your master.'"

#### For Facilitator's Guide:

### **Encouraging Deep Discipleship**

- Open in prayer, asking for the Holy Spirit's revelation of what it means to live in the economy of Heaven.
- Read Acts 2:44-45 and Luke 12:32-33 aloud. Discuss: What made the early Church so radically generous? How is this different from modern-day Christianity?

Acts 2:44-45 "And all those who had believed were together and had all things in common; and they began selling their property and possessions and were sharing them with all, as anyone might have need."

**Luke 12:32-33** "Do not be afraid, little flock, for your Father has chosen gladly to give you the kingdom. Sell your possessions and give to charity; make yourselves money belts that do not wear out, an unfailing treasure in heaven, where no thief comes near nor moth destroys."

## Ask thought-provoking questions:

- What is the difference between Kingdom stewardship and worldly ownership?
- How does RADICAL GENEROSITY break the stronghold of greed?
- What does it mean to "make deposits" in Heaven's economy?
- Encourage personal testimonies. Has God ever provided in a supernatural way when you stepped out in generosity?

## Set a clear action plan:

• How will each disciple actively demonstrate RADICAL GENEROSITY this week?

# **Grace Coaching Notes**:

The world's economy is built on scarcity—it teaches us to hoard, to fear, and to protect what we have. But the Kingdom of God operates on abundance—giving freely, trusting in God's endless supply, and investing in eternity.

Jesus modeled this perfectly. He fed thousands with a few loaves and fish, healed without charge, and poured out His very life for us. If we are His disciples, we must live the same way—with open hands, free hearts, and faith-filled giving.

# Ask yourself:

- 1. Am I holding tightly to what God has called me to release?
- 2. If I saw Jesus face-to-face today, could I say I lived a radically generous life?
- 3. Am I storing up treasures on earth or treasures in Heaven?
- 4. How is God calling me to sow into the Kingdom today?

Your next step is NOT OPTIONAL—it is obedience.

### **RADICAL GENEROSITY Directives**:

- 1. Give something of great value this week. Let your generosity cost you something. Give sacrificially to the Kingdom.
- 2. Identify someone in need and bless them anonymously. Sow into someone's life as the Holy Spirit leads you.
- 3. Pray for supernatural provision—not just for yourself, but so that you can fund the work of the Gospel on earth.

# Three Personal Challenges:

- 1. Commit to one year of RADICAL GENEROSITY. Decide today that you will live as an investor in God's Kingdom, not just a consumer in this world.
- 2. **Find a Kingdom cause to support**. Whether through KINGDOM Empowered, a missionary, a church plant, or a struggling believer, begin giving intentionally toward eternal impact.
- 3. **Break the stronghold of Mammon**. Take a bold step of faith and release financial fear—trust God fully with your resources and watch what He does!

#### Final Call to Action:

The Rapture is imminent, but our mission is far from over. The Church is being awakened to live like Jesus, to give like Jesus, and to love like Jesus. Step fully into the supernatural economy of Heaven by:

- 1. Continue through The School of KINGDOM Living. There are more courses, more revelation, and greater transformation ahead.
- 2. **Join the SAVE Coin Project**. Earn Kingdom rewards through discipleship and generosity.
- 3. Multiply your impact. Share THE Grace Awakening and bring others into this journey.
- 4. Will you be a wise and faithful steward? Will you be found worthy to reign?

**Matthew 25:21** "His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant. You were faithful with a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter the joy of your master."

<u>Closing Prayer</u>: Good Good Father in Heaven, You have entrusted me with so much—more than I deserve. Everything I have is Yours. You are my Provider, my Sustainer, and my Source. King Jesus, you are always interceding for me and on my behalf. Thank you, and PRAISE GOD! King Jesus, teach me to live with open hands, just as you do. Break the chains of fear,

greed, and self-preservation in my heart. Fill me with faith to sow into Your Kingdom without hesitation, knowing that every gift given in Your name will be multiplied for eternity. Holy Spirit, lead me in RADICAL GENEROSITY. Show me where to give, who to bless, and how to invest in the eternal riches of Heaven. I renounce the spirit of Mammon—I serve You alone, Lord Jesus. Make me a wise and faithful steward, that I may hear Your words, 'Well done, good and faithful servant.' In Jesus' name, Amen.

Day 48: The Harvest is Ripe – Pages 236 to 239

<u>Brief</u>: The harvest is ripe, and the workers are being sent. Will you fuel Kingdom expansion with RADICAL GENEROSITY? This is not the time to sit back, accumulate, or hesitate—this is the moment to give, invest, and expand the Kingdom of God.

**Matthew 9:37-38** "Then He \*said to His disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Therefore beseech the Lord of the harvest to send out workers into His harvest."

Jesus told us, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few." What does this mean? It means the opportunity for impact is now—the lost are searching, the broken are ready for healing, and the world is desperate for truth. But it takes faithful, obedient disciples to bring in the harvest.

**Luke 6:38** "Give, and it will be given to you. They will pour into your lap a good measure—pressed down, shaken together, and running over. For by your standard of measure it will be measured to you in return."

RADICAL GENEROSITY is more than just financial giving—it is giving of yourself. Your time, resources, skills, and faith are all Kingdom currency that God uses to change lives. This is your moment to act. Give—expand the Kingdom.

**John 9:4** "We must carry out the works of Him who sent Me as long as it is day; night is coming, when no one can work."

The window of opportunity is now. Jesus is calling His Church to live open-handed—not storing up treasures for themselves, but investing in eternal impact. This is the time to step into supernatural giving, supernatural provision, and supernatural faith!

**2 Corinthians 9:6-8** "Now I say this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows generously will also reap generously. Each one must do just as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace overflow to you, so that, always having all sufficiency in everything, you may have an abundance for every good deed."

Will you step up and live the lifestyle of a faithful and wise servant—the one who multiplies what has been entrusted to them?

**Proverbs 11:25** "A generous person will be prosperous, and one who gives others plenty of water will himself be given plenty."

For Facilitator's Guide: Deep Discipleship & Action Steps

## Engaging the Group:

- Start in Prayer Ask the Holy Spirit to break every fear of lack and ignite a lifestyle of faith-filled generosity.
- Read Matthew 9:37-38 Aloud Discuss what it means to be a worker in the harvest and how generosity fuels Kingdom work.

#### Ask Thought-Provoking Questions:

- What is one area of your life where you can live more generously today?
- How does knowing that your giving is an investment into eternity change your mindset?
- What does Kingdom expansion look like in your daily life?

**Encourage Radical Steps of Faith** – Challenge the group to commit to one bold act of RADICAL GENEROSITY this week.

**Accountability** – Have each participant share one way they will step into Kingdom giving this week—time, resources, or finances.

### **Grace Coaching Notes**:

The world's system teaches accumulate, hoard, and protect—but the Kingdom of God operates on giving, sowing, and trusting. God's economy is limitless. It is not bound by earthly scarcity or inflation—it functions on supernatural provision.

A Grace Coach must teach disciples to trust God as their provider and invest in eternity. That means:

- Living open-handed and releasing control.
- Stewarding wisely what God has given.
- Multiplying resources, talents, and faith.

**Aligning with Kingdom Economics**—investing in people, discipleship, and the Great Commission. Jesus' entire life was a model of RADICAL GENEROSITY. He poured out everything—His time, His wisdom, His love, His healing, and ultimately His very life.

### Ask yourself:

- 1. Am I investing in the Kingdom, or hoarding for myself?
- 2. What is one thing I can release into God's hands today?
- 3. Am I a faithful steward, or am I letting fear hold me back?

### **RADICAL GENEROSITY Directives:**

- 1. Commit 100 Hours Dedicate 100 hours of your time, skills, or talents to Kingdom work this year.
- 2. Sow into 1 BILLION Grace Homes by 2033 Support KINGDOM Empowered initiatives that train disciples, rescue orphans, and expand the Gospel.
- 3. Fund Grace Hubs & Grace Spaces Give toward decentralized resource centers that fuel revival, discipleship, and Kingdom transformation.

#### Three Personal Challenges:

- 1. **Step into Spirit-Led Giving** Ask the Holy Spirit where He wants you to give this week and obey immediately.
- 2. Adopt a New Life Practice Make open-handed giving your lifestyle, rather than just something you do occasionally.
- 3. **Live as a Kingdom Ambassador** Represent Jesus in every transaction, every relationship, and every opportunity to bless others.

### Reflection & Application:

The Rapture is coming, but what we build now will endure into eternity. A *Grace Home* is not a physical structure—it is a dwelling place of God's presence in a surrendered heart. It is where faith flourishes, discipleship multiplies, and revival is birthed.

**Matthew 18:20** "For where two or three have gathered together in My name, I am there in their midst."

# Your Next Step:

- 1. Open your home as a Grace Home.
- 2. Live as a generous steward of what God has given you.
- 3. Expand the Kingdom—not just for today, but for eternity.

#### Final Call to Action:

The future of the Church is not in mega-buildings or corporate church structures—it is in people gathering in homes, breaking bread, discipling one another, and living in RADICAL GENEROSITY. This is the model that will carry us through the final days before the Rapture and into the Millennial Kingdom. Will you be a part of it?

Step into Kingdom Economics. Live with open hands. Multiply disciples. Give radically. Prepare for Christ's return.

<u>Closing Prayer</u>: Lord Jesus, we surrender everything to You right now. We recognize that nothing we have truly belongs to us, but all things are Yours. Teach us to be faithful stewards of our time, talents, and resources. Break every stronghold of fear and lack. Fill us with the boldness to give, to sow, and to expand Your Kingdom through RADICAL GENEROSITY. Let us not be passive Christians but active Kingdom builders—fueling discipleship, expanding Grace Homes, and preparing the world for Your return. Holy Spirit, lead us in generosity, wisdom, and faith. We commit today to live as You lived—to love as You loved—to give as You gave. In Jesus' mighty name, Amen.

# Day 49: The Decentralized Church—God's Original Blueprint - Pages 240 to 243

<u>Brief</u>: The Church Jesus envisioned was never meant to be a religious institution controlled by human hierarchy. His Church was always meant to be a thriving, Spirit-led, disciple-making movement that cannot be stopped by persecution, corruption, or government interference. Yet today's centralized church system has created a passive body of lukewarm believers, fostering a culture of consumer carnal Christianity rather than active discipleship.

God is calling His people to come out of Babylon, to leave behind broken, hierarchical institutions, and to embrace a return to the decentralized, Spirit-led Church that He established in the Book of Acts. This is not a call to abandon fellowship but to return to the original Kingdom model of discipleship, empowerment, and RADICAL GENEROSITY.

Jesus Christ is the ONLY head of His Body—the Church. There is one Church, one Body, one Spirit, and we are all called to function as a UNITED BODY OF CHRIST under the authority of the one and only Head, King Jesus.

#### For Group Facilitators:

Facilitate a deep and honest discussion about the current state of the Church today. Ask participants to reflect on how modern church structures differ from the early Church described in Acts. Encourage participants to consider how they can step into God's original blueprint for discipleship and Kingdom expansion. Help them evaluate the difference between hierarchical, institutional models and the decentralized, Spirit-led model of the early Church.

Matthew 28:19-20 "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

#### Grace Coaching Notes:

The centralized church system we see today is not the Church Jesus established. Instead, it has become an institution built by men, where paid clergy lead passive audiences who attend services as consumers rather than disciples.

Acts 2:42-47 "They were continually devoting themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone kept feeling a sense of awe; and many wonders and signs were taking place through the apostles. And all those who had believed were together and had all things in common; and they began selling their property and possessions and were sharing them with all, as anyone might have need. Day by day continuing with one mind in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they were taking their meals together with gladness and sincerity of heart, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord was adding to their number day by day those who were being saved."

Jesus did not command us to build megachurches, corporate ministries, or religious denominations—He called us to make disciples who make disciples (Matthew 28:19-20). He established a decentralized, Spirit-led Church, which operated from house to house (Acts 2:42-47, Romans 16:5).

**Romans 16:5** "also greet the church that is in their house. Greet Epaenetus, my beloved, who is the first convert to Christ from Asia."

Today, millions of believers are waking up to the reality that God is calling His people out of Babylon—out of religious institutions that have aligned with the Laodicean, lukewarm system (Revelation 3:14-22). The true Church is not a building; it is a body of Spirit-filled believers operating in faith, power, and radical generosity.

Revelation 3:14-22 "The Amen, the faithful and true Witness, the Beginning of the creation of God, says this: 'I know your deeds, that you are neither cold nor hot; I wish that you were cold or hot. So because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of My mouth. Because you say, "I am rich, and have become wealthy, and have need of nothing," and you do not know that you are wretched and miserable and poor and blind and naked, I advise you to buy from Me gold refined by fire so that you may become rich, and white garments so that you may clothe yourself, and that the shame of your nakedness will not be revealed; and eye salve to anoint your eyes so that you may see. Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline; therefore be zealous and repent. Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and will dine with him, and he with Me. 21He who overcomes, I will grant to him to sit down with Me on My throne, as I also overcame and sat down with My Father on His throne. He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches.'"

As persecution increases, as governments restrict religious freedoms, as centralized institutions collapse under their own weight, only the decentralized Church will remain—thriving, unshakable, and unstoppable.

Are you ready to step into God's original design? Will you continue in a failing system, or will you become a part of the Kingdom revolution that is returning to the biblical model of discipleship?

## Radical Generosity Directive:

The Kingdom economy operates on Grace: RADICAL GENEROSITY, obedience, and faith. Unlike the corporate-driven, tithe-dependent model of institutional churches, the decentralized Church operates through Spirit-led giving—meeting needs, funding missions, and expanding the Gospel in supernatural ways.

# Today's challenge:

- Start a Grace Home Open your home for prayer, Bible study, and discipleship. Invite people to experience true biblical fellowship.
- **Give Outside the Walls** Ask God to show you where to give directly to the people He wants you to help, instead of giving to a centralized system.
- Invest in Kingdom Economics Learn about decentralized finance, Web 3.0, and faith-based economies that will sustain believers in the days ahead.

### 3 Challenge Questions:

- 1. How does the decentralized Church model differ from what we see in most churches today? (Decentralized Churches: Churches in China, Iran, and North Korea)
- 2. Are you willing to leave behind man-made structures and fully embrace discipleship as Jesus intended?

3. What step can you take TODAY to help restore God's original blueprint for the Church?

The time to act is NOW. Jesus is returning for a pure, spotless Bride—unshackled by human systems. Will you be part of the movement bringing the Church back to its Kingdom foundations?

Day 50 to 54: Your Final Step—Crafting Your Own Confession - Pages 243 to 263

<u>Brief</u>: The journey through this study guide has led us to this moment—Day 50 through 54—the final days of structured study, yet far from the conclusion of our transformation. # Why Writting YOUR OWN Confession Matters

Your confession is more than words—it is your personal declaration of faith, surrender, and commitment to Jesus Christ. It is the written testimony of God's Grace in your life, revealing how He has rescued you, transformed you, and continues to work through you. Your confession will serve as a monument of truth, reminding you of your identity in Christ, your purpose, and the power of Grace working in you daily.

#### **Biblical Foundation for Confession**

Romans 10:9-10 "That if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved; for with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation."

Revelation 12:11 "And they overcame him because of the blood of the Lamb and because of the word of their testimony, and they did not love their life even when faced with death."

Your confession is your testimony. It is a weapon of spiritual warfare. It aligns your life with God's truth and silences the voice of the enemy.

### Your Call to Action

- **1. Write Your Own Confession**: Using My Confession as an example, over the next few days use this time to write your own personal confession of faith. Be transparent. Confess your weaknesses, struggles, and failures, but more importantly, declare the power of God's Grace at work in you. Acknowledge your complete dependence on Jesus.
- **2. Declare the Truth**: Your confession should boldly proclaim that Jesus is Lord over every aspect of your life. Declare your faith in the promises of God and your identity in Christ.
- **3. Repent and Surrender:** Take responsibility for where you have fallen short, and fully surrender to Jesus. Confess any self-reliance and unbelief, and invite the Holy Spirit to transform you.
- **4. Commit to Kingdom Living**: Confess your commitment to live fully in Christ, embracing the mission of discipleship, radical generosity, and Kingdom expansion. Align your life with the Great Commission.

# The Consequences of Avoiding Your Confession

If you ignore this opportunity to write your confession, you risk the following:

- Remaining Lukewarm Without a personal confession, you may continue to live a passive Christian life, avoiding full surrender. (Revelation 3:16)
- **Stagnation in Faith** Without openly declaring God's work in your life, your growth may be hindered. (James 1:6-8)
- **Missed Transformation** Confession brings healing and breakthrough. Failing to confess keeps you stuck in old patterns. (1 John 1:9)
- Ineffective Witness Your testimony is a powerful tool for leading others to Christ. If you do not confess, you withhold your light. (Matthew 5:14-16)

**Revelation 3:16** "So because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of My mouth."

James 1:6-8 "But he must ask in faith without any doubting, for the one who doubts is like the surf of the sea, driven and tossed by the wind. For that man ought not to expect that he will receive anything from the Lord, being a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways."

**1 John 1:9** "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

Matthew 5:14-16 "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden; nor does anyone light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light shine before men in such a way that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father who is in heaven.

# Final Encouragement

Jesus is calling you into a deeper relationship with Him. Your confession is your yes to God's transformative work in your life. Do not delay. Take this step today and step into the fullness of your identity in Christ.

Acts 4:20 "For we cannot stop speaking about what we have seen and heard."

# **Group Facilitators - Calling Forth Disciples to Disciple Others**

Beloved Ambassador of Christ,

- Activation & Prayer Encourage participants to apply what they've learned. Pray for one another, lay hands, and expect transformation.
